

# Night Poaching Act 1828

### 1828 CHAPTER 69 9 Geo 4

- [F19] If persons to the number of three, being armed, enter any land for the purpose of taking or destroying game, they shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. Punishment.
  - F<sup>2</sup>... If any persons, to the number of three or more together, shall by night unlawfully enter or be in any land, whether open or inclosed, for the purpose of taking or destroying game or rabbits, any of such persons being armed with any gun, crossbow, fire arms, bludgeon, or any other offensive weapon, each and every of such persons shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof F<sup>3</sup>..., shall be liable [F<sup>4</sup>on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding [F<sup>5</sup>level 4 on the standard scale], or to both]
