CONSTRUCTION, JURISDICTION, AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

201 Provisions of Act to apply to incorporeal hereditaments.

- (1) The provisions of this Act relating to freehold land apply to manors, reputed manors, lordships, advowsons, ..., ^{F1} perpetual rentcharges, and other incorporeal hereditaments, subject only to the qualifications necessarily arising by reason of the inherent nature of the hereditament affected.
- (2) This Act does not affect the special restrictions imposed on dealing with advowsons by the ^{MI}Benefices Act, 1898, or any other statute or measure, nor affect the limitation of, or authorise any disposition to be made of, a title or dignity of honour which in its nature is inalienable.
