- (4) In the application of this Act to Ireland, the Lord Lieutenant shall be substituted for a Secretary of State.
- (5) Anything authorised under this Act to be done by the Board of Trade may be done by the President or a Secretary or Assistant Secretary of the Board, or any person authorised in that behalf by the President of the Board.

CHAPTER 88.

An Act to suspend the operation of the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, and the Welsh Church Act, 1914. [18th September 1914.]

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in the Government of Suspension of Ireland Act, 1914, no steps shall be taken to put that Act into the operation of the Governoperation, and notwithstanding anything in the Welsh Church ment of Ire-Act, 1914, the date of disestablishment under that Act shall be land Act, 1914, postponed, until the expiration of twelve months from the date Church Act, of the passing of those Acts respectively, or, if at the expiration 1914. of those twelve months the present war has not ended, until 4 & 5 Geo. 5. of those twelve months the present war has not ended, that c. 90. such later date (not being later than the end of the present 4 & 5 Geo. 5. war) as may be fixed by His Majesty by Order in Council; 4 8 5 c. 91. and the provisions of those Acts shall have effect accordingly.

(2) In this Act, the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, means any Act which becomes law during the present session, and which may be cited by that short title; and the Welsh Church Act, 1914, means any Act which becomes law during the present session and which may be cited by that short title.

2. This Act may be cited as the Suspensory Act, 1914.
