## SUMMARY JURISDICTION ACT 1857

- I Interpretation of Terms.
- II Justices on Application of a Party aggrieved to state a Case for the Opinion of Superior Court.
- III Security and Notice to be given by the Appellant.
- IV Justices may refuse a Case where they think the Application frivolous.
- V Where the Justices refuse, the Court of Queen's Bench may by Rule order a Case to be stated.
- VI Superior Court to determine the Questions on the Case. It's Decisions to be final.
- VII Case may be sent back for Amendment.
- VIII Powers of Superior Court may be exercised by a Judge at Chambers.
- IX After the Decision of Superior Court, Justices may issue Warrants.
- X Certiorari not to be required for Proceedings under this Act.
- XI Superior Courts may make Rules for Proceedings.
- XII "Justices" to include a Stipendiary Magistrate.
- XIII Recognizances how to be enforced.
- XIV Appellants under this Act not to allowed appeal to Quarter Sessions.
- XV Extent of Act.
