[^{F1}5 **Power of receiver to purchase &c.**

The receiver may, by the direction of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, transfer, demise, enfranchise, mortgage, or otherwise dispose of property of any tenure vested in him in his official capacity, . . . ^{F2}.]
