### *Supplemental Provisions*

#### **80 Penalty for throwing fireworks in thoroughfare.**

If any person throw, cast, or fire any fireworks in or into any [<sup>F1</sup>highway, street, thoroughfare,][<sup>F1</sup>road] or public place, he [<sup>F2</sup>shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale]
