## 17 Questions between husband and wife as to property to be decided in a summary way.

In any question between husband and wife as to the title to or possession of property, either party, . . . <sup>F1</sup>, may apply by summons or otherwise [<sup>F2</sup>in a summary way][<sup>F2</sup>to the High Court or [<sup>F3</sup>the family court] and the court may, on such an application (which may be heard in private), make such order with respect to the property as it thinks fit.
