1835 CHAPTER 50

III As to the Recovery of Penalties incurred for Offences against Acts repealed.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be deemed or construed to interfere with any Acts done or Contracts or Agreements heretofore made under the Authority of any of the said recited Acts, or to extend to prevent the suing for or Recovery of any Penalty incurred by any Offence committed against the Provisions of the said recited Acts or any of them previous to the Repeal of the said Acts in and b this Act, or to prevent or defeat any Prosecution commenced or to be brought for such Offence; but all Penalties and Forfeitures incurred may be sued for and recovered, and all Contracts and Agreements may be enforced, and all Encroachments, Nuisances, and other Offences made or committed previous to the Repeal of the said Acts, against the Provisions of the said Acts or any of them, may be abated or prosecuted by the Surveyor appointed under this Act, in the same Manner to all Intents and Purposes as if this Act had not been passed.
