# VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

Cap. 13.

An Act for the Sale of the Glebe Lands belonging to the Rectory of Woolwich and the Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich in the County of Kent, and to confirm the Building Leases of such Lands, and for Endowment of a new Ecclesiastical District; and for other Purposes.

[31st August 1848.]

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the Forty-ninth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act to enable the 49 G.3.c.88. Rector of the Parish and Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich in (Pr.) the County of Kent for the Time being to grant Building Leases of the Glebe Lands belonging to the said Rectory, and to sell the present Rectory House and Garden, and to build a new Rectory House, after reciting that Hugh Fraser Clerk, then Rector of the said Parish and Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich in the County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester, was in right of the said Rectory seised of certain Glebe Lands situate in the said Parish, containing Nineteen Acres Statute Measure or thereabouts, together with a Rectory House and Garden, consisting of about Half an Acre or thereabouts, and that the Right Reverend Walker then Lord Bishop of Rochester [Private.]

was in right of his See Patron of the said Rectory and Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich aforesaid, and that the said Rectory House was a very small ancient Building, which stood on the Banks of the River Thames in a Situation low and unhealthy, and that for the Reasons in the said Act mentioned great Benefit would accrue to the said Rectory, and great Convenience to the Inhabitants of the said Town, if Power was given to the Rector for the Time being to grant a Lease or Leases of the said Glebe Lands for a Term of Years sufficient to encourage Persons to build upon and improve the same, and that it would also be very beneficial to the said Rectory if Permission was given to sell the then present Rectory House and Garden, and to build a new Rectory House and provide a new Garden in a more commodious and healthy Situation on Part of the said Glebe Land near the said Parish Church, it was by the said Act now in recital enacted, that it should be lawful for the Rector of the Parish and Parish Church of Woolwich aforesaid for the Time being, with the Consent of the Bishop of Rochester for the Time being, from Time to Time to demise all or any Part or Parts of the Glebe Lands belonging to the said Rectory, not exceeding in the whole Seventeen Acres (Statute Measure) or thereabouts (particularly described in the First Schedule annexed to the said Act now in recital), for any Term or Number of Years not exceeding Ninety-nine Years, unto any Person or Persons who should be willing to take, build upon, and improve the same, by building and erecting or causing to be built and erected thereon any Houses, Outhouses, Edifices, Buildings, or Structures, together with Ground sufficient for any Garden, Yard, Roadway, or Passage for the Use and Convenience of the Lessees and others the Tenants and Occupiers of the same, which Lease or Leases should be renewable at any Time, and should commence and take effect in possession, so as on the said Lease or Leases originally to be granted or by way of Renewal there should be reserved the best and most improved yearly Ground Rent or Ground Rents that could be got or obtained for the Benefit of the said Rector and his Successors, without taking any Sum of Money or other Thing by way of Fine, except as was therein-after excepted; and it was by the said Act further enacted, that the said Rectory House and Garden, with the Appurtenances, should be vested in certain Trustees in the said Act named, upon trust to sell the same in manner in the said Act expressed, and that the Money to arise by such Sale, subject to the Payment of certain Costs, should be applied towards defraying the Expenses of building another and more substantial and commodious Rectory House on Part of the said Glebe Lands (other than the said Glebe Lands comprised in the said First Schedule to the said Act annexed), for the Residence of the said Rector and his Successors, together with at least One Acre of Ground for a Garden and Yard to the said Rectory House; and it was by the said Act provided and further enacted, that such new Rectory House, when built and finished, with the Approbation of the Bishop of Rochester for the Time being, as therein is mentioned, should be the Rectory House of the said Rector and his Successors, in lieu and instead of the then present Rectory House; and it was by the said Act further enacted, that in case the Monies arising from the Sale of the said Rectory House and Garden, with the Appurtenances, should not be sufficient

sufficient to answer the several Purposes of the said Act directed, then it should be lawful for the said Rector for the Time being to take from any Persons to whom he should grant any Lease as aforesaid any such Sum or Sums of Money by way of Fine as might be necessary towards paying the Costs and Expenses preparatory to and attending the applying for and obtaining and passing the said Act, and also towards the Expense of building and finishing such new Rectory House and Garden: And whereas the said First Schedule to the said recited Act annexed contains the Description of Nineteen Acres One Rood and Twenty-seven Perches of Land, instead of Seventeen Acres, as stated in the Reference thereto in the same Act, and the Second Schedule to the same Act contains only the Description of the old Rectory House and Garden of the said Parish and Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich, and which are therein expressed to contain One Rood and Twenty-five Perches of Land: And whereas the said new Rectory House and Garden were built and appropriated on and out of Part of the Glebe Lands of the said Rectory, Part of the Lands comprised in the First Schedule to the said Act, the Second Schedule containing only the old Rectory House and Garden directed to be sold; and it is apprehended that as the whole Glebe belonging to the said Rectory was comprised in the said First and Second Schedules, the Reference in the said Act that the said House and Garden was to be built on and appropriated out of the said Glebe, other than what was comprised in the First Schedule, was an Error: And whereas Leases of the said Glebe Lands have from Time to Time been granted by the Rector of the said Parish for the Time being, and such Leases were expressed or intended to be made in pursuance of the Powers in the said recited Act contained, and on the Faith of such Leases having been or being then about to be granted many Buildings have been erected on Parts of the said Glebe Lands comprised in such Leases, and Possession has been had for many Years past under such Leases, and several Streets, Lanes, Ways, and Passages were before the granting the said Leases laid out and formed on Parts of the said Glebe Lands not comprised in the said Leases, and the Parts so leased abut on and are wholly or partly bounded by the said Streets, Lanes, Ways, and Passages, or some of them, and such Streets, Lanes, Ways, and Passages are the only Roads or Ways to or from the Parts so leased, and have been used by the said Lessees and others, and have been for Twenty Years and upwards last past and are now repaired by the Commissioners appointed by or in pursuance of an Act passed in the Second Session of Parliament held in the Forty-seventh Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 111., as public Highways of the said Parish: And whereas, by reason of the Limitation of the leasing Powers of the said recited Act to a Part or Parts only of the said Glebe Lands not exceeding in the whole Seventeen Acres or thereabouts, Doubts have arisen as to whether the leasing Powers given by the said recited Act extended to all the said Glebe Lands comprised in the said First Schedule thereto, and if not then to which the said leasing Powers does extend; And whereas it is apprehended that many of the said Leases so granted as aforesaid may have been granted without the Consent of the said Lord Bishop, duly signified as required by the said recited Act,

Act, and that others of such Leases have been granted after the

Erection of Buildings, in consideration of the Erection whereof, and

of Rents thereby reserved, such Leases were expressed to be granted;

and that in others of such Leases the Terms created or expressed to be created thereby have been made to take effect in futuro, and that of others of such Leases no Counterparts have been executed, and that as to others of such Leases Doubts may be raised whether by reason of Buildings having been already erected at the Date thereof the best and most improved Ground Rents have been thereby reserved, and that others of such Leases do not contain all the Covenants, Powers, Provisoes, and Conditions required by the said recited Act to be inserted therein, and that the Execution of others of such Leases has not been duly attested, as required by the said recited Act, and it is therefore apprehended that many of such Leases are void or voidable in Law, although the same may appear to have been granted substantially in accordance with the Intent and Meaning of the said recited Act, and it is apprehended that Objections to the Title of the said Rector to the Reversion of and in the said Glebe, as well as to the Title of the Lessees or Parties holding under such Leases, may arise on the same being required to be sold The District and offered for Sale: And whereas under the Provisions of an Act of St. Thomas passed in the Session of Parliament held in the Sixth and Seventh formed partly Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to make better Provision for the Spiritual Care of populous Parishes, an Ecclesiastical District, consisting of Part of the said Parish of Woolwich, and also of Part of the Parish of Charlton in the said County of Kent, was, on the Representation and Recommendation of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and with the Consent of the Lord Bishop of Rochester, by virtue of and in conformity to an Order in Council of Her present Majesty dated the Twenty-sixth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and forty-five, constituted a separate District for spiritual Purposes, by the Name of "The District of Saint Thomas Woolwich:" And whereas the most populous Part of the said District of Saint Thomas Woolwich, was taken out of the said Parish of Woolwich, and by reason of the Poverty of the Population of such District the Funds for erecting a Church therein have not been provided, and Divine Service is now performed in a Room provided and now used for that Purpose: And whereas under the Provisions of an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the Sixth and Seventh Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled An Act for carrying into effect to Diocese of the Reports of the Commissioners appointed to consider the State of the London, pur- Established Church in England and Wales, with reference to Ecclesiastical Duties and Revenues, so far as they relate to Episcopal Dioceses, Revenues, and Patronage, and of another Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the Fifth and Sixth Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to alter and amend the Law relating to Ecclesiastical Houses of Residence, the said Parishes of Charlton and Woolwich, with several other Parishes respectively situate in the Counties of Kent and Surrey in the Diocese and Archdeaconry of Rochester, were, on the Representation of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and with the Consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Charles James Bishop

out of the Parish of Woolwich, pursuant to 6 & 7 Vict. c. 37. and Order in Council of 26th April 1845.

Parish of Woolwich transferred from Diocese of Rochester suant to 6&7 W. 4. c. 77. and Order in Council of 8th August 1845.

of London and the Right Reverend George Bishop of Rochester, by virtue of and in conformity to an Order in Council of Her present Majesty dated the Eighth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty-five, detached and dissevered from the said Diocese of Rochester, and included in and ordered to form Part of the said Diocese of London, and until further or other Order of Her said Majesty in Council the same several Parishes were ordered to be included in and to form Part of the Archdeaconry of Middlesex: And whereas no Direction was contained in the said Order of Council of the Eighth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and fortyfive for transferring the Patronage of the said Rectory of the Parish of Saint Mary Woolwich from the said George Bishop of Rochester to the said Charles James Bishop of London, and his Successors Bishops of London, and consequently the Patronage of the said Rectory remains vested in the said George Bishop of Rochester until the next Avoidance of the said See of Rochester: And whereas the Population of the Parish of Woolwich is great and increasing, and it is in contemplation to make Application for the Formation of an Ecclesiastical District or separate Parish for Ecclesiastical Purposes wholly or partly out of the said Parish, to be called the District of Saint Paul's Woolwich, but owing to the Poverty of the Inhabitants of the said intended District great Difficulty is apprehended in providing a separate and adequate Endowment for the Minister of such intended District: And whereas the Reverend William Greenlaw is the present Rector of the said Rectory of Woolwich and Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich, and the Right Reverend Father in God George, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Rochester, is in right of his See the Patron of the said Rectory, and the Right Reverend Father in God Charles James, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of London, is in right of his See the Ordinary thereof: And whereas it is expedient, in order to avoid Doubts and Litigation between the Rector and his Parishioners with reference to the said Leases so granted as aforesaid, to enable the present and any future Rector of the said Parish and Parish Church to confirm the said Leases as after mentioned: And whereas it is expedient for the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being of the said Parish of Woolwich and Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich, with such Consent as is after mentioned, should have the Power to sell the said Glebe Lands belonging to the said Rectory, subject to the said Leases, to be confirmed as after mentioned, and to apply the Monies arising from any Sale or Sales thereof in manner herein-after provided; and it is also expedient that a Portion of the Funds arising from such Sales should be applied in aid of the Funds for erecting a Church for the said District of Saint Thomas Woolwich, and that a further Portion thereof should be employed in providing an Endowment for the Minister of the said intended District of Saint Paul's; and it is also expedient, for the Avoidance of Doubts, to declare that the Land appropriated for the Erection of the said new Rectory House so erected as aforesaid, and for the Garden thereof, hath been well appropriated in accordance with the Provisions of the said recited Act: Wherefore Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subject the said William Greenlaw doth most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most [Private.] Excellent 4 *m* 

Power to Rector, with Consent of Patron and Ordinary, to confirm Leases, upon Application.

Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act it shall and may be lawful for the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being of the said Parish of Woolwich, if he shall so see fit, by and with the Consent of the Patron and Ordinary for the Time being of the said Rectory, to be signified by any Writing under their Hands, from Time to Time and at any Time before the Glebe Lands comprised in the said Leases respectively shall be sold, as by this Act authorized, upon the Application in Writing of the Parties respectively having the legal Estate or Interest in all or any of the said Leases of the said Glebe Lands heretofore granted, or purporting or expressed or intended to have been granted, by virtue or in pursuance of the Powers in the said firstly recited Act contained, (and a Schedule of which said Leases is to this Act annexed,) or who would have had the legal Estate or Interest therein vested in him, her, or them, if such Leases had been made, granted, and executed in pursuance of and in accordance with the Powers, Provisions, and Directions in the said firstly recited Act contained, at the sole Costs and Charges of the said Parties so making Application as aforesaid, by any Indenture to be made between the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being and the said Parties so making Application as aforesaid, of which a Counterpart shall also be executed, to make valid and absolutely confirm all or any of the said Leases of the said Glebe Lands in respect of which such Application shall be made as aforesaid; and every such Lease so respectively confirmed and made valid, and the Counterparts thereof respectively, shall be and shall be taken and considered to be in all respects as valid Leases and Counterparts as from the original making or granting or Execution of such confirmed Leases respectively, and as if such Leases respectively had been duly authorized by the said firstly recited Act, and had been made, granted, or executed pursuant to the Powers, Provisions, and Directions in the said firstly recited Act contained, and notwithstanding any of the Hereditaments therein comprised may not have been authorized to be demised by the said firstly recited Act, by reason of the aforesaid Discrepancy in the Statement of the Quantity and Amounts authorized by the said Act to be demised, and the Amount or Description of the Glebe Lands comprised in the said First Schedule to the said firstly recited Act, and notwithstanding the same may not have been, for the Reasons herein-before mentioned, or any of them, or for any technical Reason; granted in conformity with the Powers, Provisions, and Directions in the said firstly recited Act contained; and after any of the Leases respectively shall have been so confirmed and made valid as aforesaid, all the Covenants, Provisoes, and Agreements in the said Leases and Counterparts respectively contained shall be and shall be taken and considered to be valid and effectual Covenants, and may be enforced. by the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being, as to all Breaches or Defaults thereof that have been or may hereafter be committed, in the same Manner to all Intents and Purposes as if the said Leases so respectively confirmed and made valid as aforesaid had been duly authorized by the said first-recited Act, and had been made, granted, and executed pursuant to the Powers, Provisoes, Conditions,

Conditions, and Limitations in the said firstly recited Act contained, and had been valid and effectual at the Time of the making, granting, or Execution thereof, notwithstanding the same may not be in conformity with the Powers, Provisions, and Directions of such Act, or any other Matter or Thing whatsoever: Provided nevertheless, that no Confirmation under this Act of any of the said Leases shall alter, prejudice, or extend any of the Rights or Liabilities under the said Leases of any Person or Persons other than the Rector for the Time being of the said Parish, and Patron and Ordinary of the said Rectory, and the Parties making such Application as herein-before mentioned, and all Persons claiming by, through, or under them respectively, but the Rights and Liabilities of all Persons under the said Leases, other than the Persons aforesaid, shall be and remain the same in all respects as if no such Confirmation had been made.

II. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Rector, with Rector and the Rector for the Time being of the said Parish of Woolwich and Parish Church of Saint Mary Woolwich, by and with the subject to Consent of the Patron and Ordinary for the Time being of the said the Leases. Rectory, to be signified by any Writing, to make sale and absolutely dispose of all and singular the said Glebe Lands and Hereditaments belonging to the said Rectory, other than the said new Rectory House, Garden, and Offices, either at one Time or at several Times, and either in one Lot or several Lots, and either by public Auction or by private Contract, or partly in each Mode, (subject to any Leases which may from Time to Time be subsisting on any Part thereof,) to any Person or Persons whomsoever, for such Price or Prices in Money as to such Rector, with the Consent and Approbation of the Patron and Ordinary for the Time being, shall seem reasonable, and upon such Terms, and subject to such Conditions, Stipulations, and Agreements as to Title or Evidence of Title, as such Rector shall think fit, with full Power, Liberty, and Authority respectively to such Rector to buy in the said Premises or any of them, or any Part or Parts thereof, at any Sale by Auction, or to rescind, alter, or vary any Contract or Agreement for Sale thereof or of any Part thereof, and in like Manner, with such Consent as aforesaid, to sell and dispose of the Premises so bought in or comprised in any such rescinded Contract at any future Auction or by. private Contract, without being answerable for any Loss which may happen by such buying in or rescinding or Re-sale, and to perform and execute all such Acts, Deeds, Matters, and Things as may be requisite and proper for effecting such Sale or Sales; and further, upon Payment into the Bank of England, in manner herein-after mentioned, of the Purchase Monies arising from the Sale or Sales hereby authorized to be made, it shall be lawful for such Rector, with such Consent as aforesaid, and so testified as aforesaid, to convey and assure the Premises which shall be so sold unto and to the Use of the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof respectively, his, her, or their Heirs, Successors, or Assigns, as he, she, or they shall respectively direct or appoint; and any Contract made for the Sales of any of the said Hereditaments, with such Consent as aforesaid, shall be as binding on any succeeding Rector in all respects as if he had entered into and executed the same: Provided nevertheless, that when

when the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being, under the Powers of any Act of Parliament now in force or hereafter to be passed, is or shall be authorized to sell or exchange any Part of the said Glebe Lands belonging to the said Rectory, without the Consent of the Patron and Ordinary, any such Sales or Exchanges may be made and effected in all respects according to the Powers and Provisoes of the said Acts, anything herein-before contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding, but that the Monies to arise from any such Sale or Exchange shall be paid and applied in all respects as is hereafter provided with respect to Monies to arise under the Sales to be made in pursuance of this Act.

Purchase Monies to be Bank of England in the Name of the Accountant General.

III. And be it further enacted, That the Purchaser or Purchasers, under the Provisions of this Act, of the said Glebe Lands and Herepaid into the ditaments or any Part thereof, shall pay his, her, or their Purchase Monies for the same into the Bank of England in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the High Court of Chancery, to be placed to an Account to be entitled "The Purchase Money of the Glebe Lands of the Parish of Woolwich," pursuant to the Method prescribed by the Act passed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of King George the First, Chapter 32, and the Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of Queen Victoria, Chapter 5, and the General Orders of the said Court, and without Fee or Reward, according to the Act passed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of King George the Second, Chapter 24.

Certificate of Accountant General, with Bank Receipt, to be Discharge.

IV. And be it further enacted, That the Certificate or Certificates of the said Accountant General, together with the Receipt or Receipts of One of the Cashiers of the Bank of England thereto annexed, and therewith filed in the Register Office of the said Court of Chancery, of the Payment into the Bank of England of such Purchase Money as aforesaid, or an Office Copy or Office Copies thereof, shall from Time to Time and at all Times be a good and sufficient Discharge to the Person or Persons making such Payment, and his, her, or their Successors, Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns respectively, for the Monies for which such Certificate: or Certificates and such Receipt or Receipts shall be so given, and after the filing of such Certificate or Certificates such Person or Persons as aforesaid, and his, her, or their Successors, Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns respectively, shall be absolutely and for ever freed and discharged of and from the same Monies, and shall not be answerable or accountable for any Loss, Misapplication, or Nonapplication thereof or of any Part thereof.

Investment of 'V. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Accountant General, as and when the Monies to arise from such Sale or Sales as aforesaid shall be paid in, upon the Request of the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being of the said Parish, from Time to Time to lay out and invest the same in the Purchase of Three Pounds per Cent. Consolidated Bank Annuities or Three Pounds per Cent. Reduced Bank Annuities, to be placed to the like. Account.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Rector, with Rector and the Rector for the Time being of the said Parish, by and with the Assent of the said Patron and Ordinary, to be testified by appropriate any Writing, to appropriate and set apart or agree to appropriate 2,7001, to and set apart, by any Deed under the Hand and Seal of the said building a Rector for the Time being, any Part of the Monies to arise from any such Sales as aforesaid, or of any Investment of such Monies, not of St. Thomas. exceeding the Sum of Two thousand seven hundred Pounds Sterling in the whole, in or towards the Erection or Completion of a Church within the said District of Saint Thomas Woolwich, to be consecrated and set apart, when completed, for Divine Worship according to the Rites and Ceremonies of the United Church of England and Ireland, and without any Term or Condition being annexed to such Appropriation, or upon such Terms and Conditions as to certain Pews being set apart in the said Church to be erected in the said District, and the Rents appropriated for the Use of the Minister thereof, or otherwise, as to the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being shall seem expedient; and thereupon, and upon the Petition of such Rector, it shall be lawful for the said Court of Chancery, on such Petition being presented, in a summary Way, to order and direct the Payment of the Monies so authorized to be and so appropriated either to the Rector of the said Rectory for the Time being or to any Society or Committee organized or appointed for carrying into effect the Erection of such Church, to be applied by him or them to the Purposes aforesaid, and in all respects as the said Court shall direct, and for that Purpose to order and direct the Sale of any of the Stocks or Funds in which the said Monies shall be invested, or otherwise, as to the said Court may seem expedient.

Reduced Bank Annuities, in the Name of the Accountant General, to the same Account, and by any Order to direct the Dividends thereof to be [Private.] paid 4 n

And be it further enacted, That when all the Costs and Expenses herein-after mentioned, and the said Sums of Two thousand seven hundred Pounds and Eighteen thousand Pounds shall have been paid and invested as aforesaid, if it shall appear that the Residue of the Monies to arise from such Sales as aforesaid shall be sufficient to produce at the least a surplus Income of One hundred and fifty Pounds a Year, then it shall be lawful for the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being, by any Deed or Deeds in Writing under his Hand and Seal, with the Consent of the Patron and Ordinary for the Time being of the said Rectory, to be signified by any Writing under the Hands and Seals or Hand and Seal of such Patron and Ordinary, to appropriate and set apart and to agree to appropriate and set apart a Portion of the Income of the said Rectory arising from the said Glebe Lands, or from the Monies arising from the Sale thereof, not exceeding the annual Sum of Three hundred Pounds, but not less than the Sum of One hundred and fifty Pounds, in or towards the Endowment of the said intended District of Saint Paul's Woolwich, but so that no Part of such Endowment shall consist of the Income of the said Sum of Eighteen thousand Pounds so to be invested as aforesaid, and such Appropriation shall be made in such Manner as the said Court of Chancery on a summary Application shall direct, but nevertheless on condition that the Patronage of the said District shall be vested in the Patron of the Advowson of the said Parish of Woolwich; and when and so soon as such Income arising as aforesaid shall be sufficient to produce such Surplus of One hundred and fifty Ponnds, the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being is hereby directed to make all such Applications and to take all such Proceedings as shall be necessary for the procuring the Formation of such intended District as aforesaid.

X. And be it enacted, That, until such Appropriations and Payments shall have been made as aforesaid, all and every the Rents and Profits arising from the said Glebe Lands, and the Income of the Monies to arise from the Sale thereof, and of the Funds wherein the same shall be invested, shall be paid to or received by the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being of the said Parish, in the same Manner as is before provided with respect to the Income of the said Sum of Eighteen thousand Pounds, and the Funds in or upon which the same is by this Act directed to be invested.

XI. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Court of Chancery, upon Petition or Petitions to be presented in a summary Way by the said Rector and the Rector for the Time being, with the Consent and Concurrence of the Patron and Ordinary thereof, from Time to Time to order that the said Sum of Eighteen thousand Pounds so carried to the Account entitled "The Rector of the Parish of Woolwich," or any Part thereof, or the Produce of the Sale or Sales or Conversion of the Stocks or Funds on which the same or any Part or Parts thereof shall, pursuant to the Provisions
