An Act to enable the Trustees of the Will of *Matthew Butterwick* Esquire to sell the Rectory and Tithes of *Thirsk*, held by Lease for Lives under the Archbishop of *York*, and certain Policies of Assurance, and for the Investment of the Proceeds, and for other Purposes ; of which the Short Title is "*Butterwick's Estate Act, 1856.*" [14th July 1856.]

WHEREAS *Matthew Butterwick*, late of *Thirsk* in the County of *York*, Esquire, by his last Will and Testament, bearing Date on or about the Third Day of *August* One thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, duly executed and attested as by Law was then required for the Devise of Freehold Estates, gave and devised his Rectory and Parsonage of *Thirsk* aforesaid, with the Mansion House, Buildings, Gardens, Orchards, Dovehouses, Barns, Stables, Edifices, Glebe Lands, Pastures, Feedings, Tithes, Oblations, Obventions, Fruits, Rights, Profits, Commodities, Emoluments, and Advantages thereto belonging, held by Lease for Three Lives under the Archbishop of *York*, unto and to the Use of *Valentine Kitching-*

man of Thirsk aforesaid, Esquire, and *John Sanders Walton* of *Northallerton* in the said County of *York*, Gentleman, their Heirs and Assigns, during all his the Testator's Estate and Interest therein, upon trust to do every Act that might be necessary for the obtaining of a new Lease of the same Rectory and Premises from Time to Time as often as any of the Persons upon whose Lives the then present or any future Lease thereof did or might depend should or might depart this Life, and by and out of the Rents and Profits of the said Leasehold Premises to pay so much and such Part of the Rents reserved and to be reserved by the then present and every future Lease thereof as the same Premises were liable or contributory to pay, and to perform the Covenants therein contained, so far as the same did or should relate to the same Premises, and also by and out of the Rents and Profits of the said Leasehold Premises, or by Mortgage thereof, to raise and levy from Time to Time such Sum or Sums of Money as should be sufficient for paying the Fine, Fees, and Expenses incident to every such Renewal, and to apply the Money so to be raised for the answering of that Purpose accordingly; and the Testator declared and directed that the said *Valentine Kitchingman* and *John Sanders Walton*, their Heirs and Assigns, should stand and be seised of the said Leasehold Rectory and Premises during the Continuance of the then present and every future Lease thereof (subject nevertheless to the Trusts therein-before thereof declared) upon the Trusts following; (that is to say,) as to One Fourth Part thereof in trust for the Testator's Nephew the Reverend *Robert Lascelles* and his Assigns during the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Robert Lascelles* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and for the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the Testator's Nephew *John Francis Lascelles* (who is throughout the said Will by Mistake called *John Lascelles*) and his Assigns during the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *John Francis Lascelles*, lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust to pay the Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof into the proper Hands of the Testator's Niece *Hannah Frances Hird*, or to the Hands of such Person or Persons as she by any Note or Writing under her Hand should from Time to Time, but not by way of Anticipation, appoint to receive the same, during her Life, for her sole and separate Use, as therein mentioned, with Remainder in Trust for all and every the Child and Children

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Children of the said *Hannah Frances Hird* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the Testator's Niece *Mary Lascelles* and her Assigns during the Term of her natural Life, and from and after her Decease in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Mary Lascelles* lawfully to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Robert Lascelles, John Francis Lascelles, Hannah Frances Hird, and Mary Lascelles*, in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and their respective Heirs and Assigns; and as to One other Fourth Part of the said Leasehold Rectory and Premises in trust for the said *John Francis Lascelles* and his Assigns during the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *John Francis Lascelles* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and for the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Robert Lascelles* and his Assigns during the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Robert Lascelles* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or among them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and for the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Mary Lascelles* and her Assigns during the Term of her natural Life, with Remainder in trust for her Children in Tail in manner aforesaid, with Remainder in trust to pay the Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof into the proper Hands of the said *Hannah Frances Hird*, or to the Hands of such Person or Persons as she by any Note or Writing under her Hand should from Time to Time, but not by way of Anticipation, appoint to receive the same, during her Life, to the Intent that the same might be for her sole and separate Use, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Hannah Frances Hird* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Robert Lascelles, John Francis Lascelles, Hannah Frances Hird, and Mary Lascelles*, in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, their respective Heirs and Assigns;

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Assigns; and as to One other Fourth Part of the said Leasehold Rectory and Premises in trust to pay the Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof into the proper Hands of the said *Hannah Frances Hird*, or to the Hands, of such Person or Persons as she, by any Note or Writing, under her Hand, should from Time to Time, but not by way of Anticipation, appoint to receive the same, during her Life, to the Intent that the same might be for her sole and separate Use, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Hannah Frances Hird* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Robert Lascelles* and his Assigns during the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Robert Lascelles* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and for the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *John Francis Lascelles* and his Assigns during the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *John Francis Lascelles* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and for the Heirs of the Body or respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Mary Lascelles* and her Assigns during the Term of her natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Mary Lascelles* lawfully to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Robert Lascelles*, *John Francis Lascelles*, *Hannah Frances Hird*, and *Mary Lascelles* in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, their respective Heirs and Assigns; and as to the remaining Fourth Part of the said Leasehold Rectory and Premises in trust for the said *Mary Lascelles* and her Assigns during the Term of her natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Mary Lascelles* lawfully to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, and in default of such Issue in trust for the said *Robert Lascelles* and his Assigns during the

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the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Robert Lascelles* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and for the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *John Francis Lascelles* and his Assigns during the Term of his natural Life, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *John Francis Lascelles* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and for the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust to pay the Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof into the proper Hands of the said *Hannah Frances Hird*, or to the Hands of such Person or Persons as she by any Note in Writing under her Hand should from Time to Time, but not by way of Anticipation, appoint to receive the same, during her Life, to the Intent that the same might be for her sole and separate Use, with Remainder in trust for all and every the Child and Children of the said *Hannah Frances Hird* lawfully begotten or to be begotten, to be divided between or amongst them in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, and the Heirs of the Body and respective Bodies of all and every such Child and Children, with cross Remainders in Tail between or among such Children, with Remainder in trust for the said *Robert Lascelles, John Francis Lascelles, Hannah Frances Hird, and Mary Lascelles*, in equal Shares as Tenants in Common, their respective Heirs and Assigns; and the said Testator appointed the said *Valentine Kitchingman* and *John Sanders Walton* to be Executors of that his Will; and the said Testator did thereby declare and direct, that if the said *Valentine Kitchingman* and *John Sanders Walton*, or either of them, or any future Trustee or Trustees to be appointed as therein-after was mentioned, should happen to die, or decline to act in the Trusts thereby reposed in them as aforesaid, before the said Trusts should be fully performed or discharged, then and in such Case, and when and as often as the same should happen, it should and might be lawful to or for the Trustee or Trustees so declining to act, or the Executors or Administrators of such of them so dying, in the Manner therein mentioned, from Time to Time to nominate or appoint any other Person or Persons to be a Trustee or Trustees in the Stead or Place of the Trustee or Trustees so dying or declining to act as aforesaid, and thereupon the Trust Estate and Premises were, in the usual Terms and Language of such Powers, directed to be conveyed, assigned, and transferred, and that every such new Trustee should and might in all Things act and assist in the Management, carrying on, and Execution of the Trusts to which they should be so appointed, as

fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever, and should have and be considered as vested with such and the same Powers and Authorities, as if he or they had been originally in and by the said Will nominated a Trustee or Trustees for the Purposes for which such new Trustee or Trustees should be appointed a Trustee or Trustees: And whereas the said *Matthew Butterwick* departed this Life on or about the Seventeenth Day of *January* One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, without having revoked or altered his said Will, except by a Codicil thereto which did not affect the herein-before recited Devises and Trusts, and the said Will and Codicil were duly proved in the Prerogative Court of the Archbishop of *York* on the Seventh Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine by the said *John Sanders Walton* alone, the said *Valentine Kitchingman* having renounced: And whereas since the Decease of the said *Matthew Butterwick* the Testator Two Appointments of new Trustees have been made under or by virtue of the Power in that Behalf contained in his herein-before recited Will, one of which Appointments was made by an Indenture dated on or about the Fifth Day of *February* One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, whereby *Henry Wickham Hird* of *Kirklees Hall* in the County of *York*, Esquire, (who has since by Royal Licence assumed the Surname of *Wickham*,) was appointed a new Trustee of the said Will in the Room of the said *Valentine Kitchingman* who retired from the Trusteeship, and the other of the said Appointments was made by an Indenture dated on or about the Nineteenth Day of *November* One thousand eight hundred and forty-four, whereby *Thomas Swarbreck* of *Thirsk* aforesaid, Solicitor, was nominated and appointed a new Trustee of the said Will in the Room and Place of the said *John Sanders Walton*, who departed this Life on the Thirty-first Day of *August* One thousand eight hundred and forty-four, having by his last Will and Testament, bearing Date the Twenty-fourth Day of *May* One thousand eight hundred and forty-one, appointed his Wife *Charlotte Caroline Walton* Executrix thereof, who duly proved the same in the Prerogative Court of *Canterbury* on the Seventh Day of *November* One thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and by the said Indentures respectively the Trust Premises were duly conveyed and assured accordingly: And whereas the Leases of the said Rectory and Premises were from Time to Time renewed by the Trustees of the herein-before recited Will, as thereby directed, and ultimately, by an Indenture of Lease bearing Date on or about the Thirteenth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and fifty, made between the Most Reverend Father in God *Thomas* Lord Archbishop of *York*, Primate of *England* and Metropolitan, of the one Part, and the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck* of the other Part, the said Most Reverend Father, as well in consideration of the Surrender of certain Indentures of Lease therein referred to,

as

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as for divers other Considerations, did demise, grant, and to farm let unto the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck*, their Heirs and Assigns, all that the Rectory and Parsonage of *Thirsk* in the said County of *York*, with the Houses, Buildings, Gardens, Orchards, Dovehouses, Barns, Stables, Edifices, Glebe Lands, Pastures, and Feedings, with all and singular the Tithe Rentcharges for which the Tithes of the said Rectory had been commuted, or intended so to be, under the Provisions of an Act passed in the Session held in the Sixth and Seventh Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King *William* the Fourth, intituled *An Act for the Commutation of Tithes in England and Wales*, but variable, nevertheless, according to the Provisions of the same Act, and also all Tithes (if any), Oblations, Obventions, Fruits, Rights, Profits, Commodities, Emoluments, and Advantages, with the Appurtenances, whatsoever they be, unto the said Rectory and Parsonage belonging or in anywise appertaining, (save and except the Tithe Rentcharge and Tithes, if any, arising within the Hamlet of *Thorpfield*, which were then held of the said Most Reverend Father by *John Rob* of *Thorpfield* aforesaid, Gentleman, under a separate Lease, and also except all that Mansion House, with the Cottages, Buildings, and Garden thereunto adjoining and belonging, containing by Admeasurement One Acre One Rood and Twenty-nine Perches, situate at *Thirsk* aforesaid, and bounded as therein mentioned, and also except all the Pews in the Chancel in the said Parish Church of *Thirsk* aforesaid, with the Schoolroom under the same,) to hold the said demised Premises unto the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck*, their Heirs and Assigns, for and during the natural Lives of *John Wetherill*, therein described, then of the Age of Twenty-nine Years or thereabouts, *Robert Jordison*, also therein described, then of the Age of Twenty-six Years or thereabouts, and *Monica Swarbreck*, also therein described, then of the Age of Twelve Years or thereabouts, and for and during the natural Life of the longest Liver of them, yielding and paying yearly unto the said Most Reverend Father and his Successors the full Sum or yearly Rent of Twenty Pounds One Shilling, payable half-yearly, as therein mentioned, and likewise yielding and paying, to be employed by way of Salary to the Curate of the Mother Church of *Thirsk* aforesaid, to be named and appointed by the said Most Reverend Father and his Successors for the Time being, yearly during the Term of the Lives aforesaid, the yearly Sum of Forty Pounds, and also that the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck*, and their Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, should, at their own proper Costs and Charges, provide, find, and keep so many or sufficient able and orderly allowed Ministers to say Divine Service and administer the Sacraments to the Parishioners within the several Chapelries of *Sowerby*, *Carlton*, and *Sandhutton*, belonging to the said Parish

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Parish Church of *Thirsk*, as had been accustomed to be found and kept or allowed by the Farmer or Occupier of the said Rectory or Parsonage, and thereof should acquit and discharge the said Most Reverend Father and his Successors during the Term of the Lives aforesaid: And whereas since the Decease of the said *Matthew Butterwick* the Testator the said *Robert Lascelles* hath departed this Life, without having had any Issue, and also without having disposed by Will or otherwise of his Parts or Shares in the said Leasehold Premises under the ultimate Limitations in remainder contained in the herein-before recited Will, leaving the said *John Francis Lascelles*, his only Brother and Heir-at-Law, him surviving: And whereas the said *John Francis Lascelles* has had Issue One Child only, who departed this Life in the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, of the Age of Nineteen Years or thereabouts, unmarried: And whereas the said *John Francis Lascelles* is of the Age of Seventy Years or thereabouts, and his present Wife, the Mother of the said Child, is still living: And whereas the said *Hannah Frances Hird* hath also departed this Life, without having disposed by Sale or otherwise of her Parts or Shares in remainder in the said Leasehold Premises, leaving *Jane Hird*, her only Child and Heir-at-Law, her surviving: And whereas since the Decease of the said Testator the said *Mary Lascelles* hath also departed this Life, without having been married, and without having disposed, by Will or otherwise, of her Shares and Interests in the said Leasehold Premises, under or by virtue of the ultimate Limitations concerning the said respective undivided Fourth Parts of the said Premises contained in the said Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick*, and upon such the Decease of her the said *Mary Lascelles* the said Shares in remainder descended to the said *John Francis Lascelles* as her surviving Brother and Heir-at-Law: And whereas Part of the Tithes belonging to the said Rectory was disposed of by the said *Matthew Butterwick* the Testator in his Lifetime, and the same was, by an Indenture bearing Date on or about the Thirteenth Day of *May* One thousand eight hundred and thirteen, granted to Trustees for the several Purchasers thereof, and the Residue of the Premises comprised in the said Indenture of Lease consists of the several Particulars specified and set forth in the First Schedule to this Act, which Schedule accordingly represents the said Leasehold Premises now belonging to the Estate of the said Testator, and the same produce (calculating the Tithe Rentcharge upon the Averages as published in the *London Gazette* of the Eleventh Day of *January* last) a Rental or Income amounting in the whole to the clear annual Sum of Nine hundred and thirty-six Pounds Nine Shillings and Tenpence Halfpenny, after deducting thereout the Rents reserved by the said Indenture of Lease, and, as to the Tithe Rentcharge, the parochial and other legal Charges thereon: And whereas the said Indenture of the Thirteenth Day of *May* One thousand eight

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eight hundred and thirteen contains a Covenant by and on the Part of the said *Matthew Butterwick*, for the Production and furnishing Copies and Abstracts of the then existing and all future Indentures of Lease comprising the said Rectory and Tithes (Part whereof was thereby conveyed), for the Benefit of the Purchasers of the Tithes comprised in and granted by the said Indenture of the Thirteenth Day of *May* One thousand eight hundred and thirteen: And whereas the Archbishop of *York* has caused it to be intimated to the Trustees of the said Will, that in consequence of the Provisions contained in the Act passed in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to facilitate the Management and Improvement of Episcopal and Capitular Estates in England*, and another Act of the Seventeenth and Eighteenth Years of the same Reign, for continuing and amending the Provisions thereof, no reasonable Expectation can be entertained that any further or renewed Lease of the said Rectory and Premises will be granted, but that he is willing, under and by virtue of the enabling Powers contained in the said Acts, to negotiate with the said Trustees for the Purchase or Exchange of their Estate and Interest in the Premises comprised in the said Indenture of Lease: And whereas great Advantage would accrue to the Persons interested in the said Leasehold Premises under the said Will, and especially to those who may eventually become absolutely entitled thereto, if a Sale or Exchange of the said Premises could be effected to or with the said Archbishop of *York*, and the said *John Francis Lascelles*, as Tenant for Life in possession of Three undivided Fourth Parts thereof, is willing and desirous to facilitate and promote such Sale or Exchange, and even if the Negotiation with the Archbishop of *York* should not result in his acquiring the said Leasehold Premises by Purchase or Exchange, it would be highly advantageous to the Persons interested therein under or by virtue of the said Will that a Sale or Exchange thereof should be effected to or with some other Person or Persons, or Body or Bodies Corporate, and more especially as the Scheme and Intention of the said *Matthew Butterwick* the Testator in providing for the successive Renewals of the Leases from Time to Time have been wholly frustrated by the Operation of the recent Enactments and Changes affecting Ecclesiastical Property: And whereas the Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick* does not contain any Power of Sale or Exchange by virtue whereof any Sale or Exchange of the said Leasehold Premises can be effected: And whereas each of the Three Policies of Assurance specified in the Second Schedule to this Act was effected by the Trustees for the Time being of the said Will on One of the Lives for which the said recited Indenture of Lease is held, in order to raise and form a Fund to provide for the Fine and Expenses of Renewal when any of the Lives in the said Lease should drop: And whereas by reason of the Failure and Frustration of the Testator's Intention and Scheme for the continued

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Renewal of the said Leases in manner aforesaid, and considering that in the probable Event of the Failure of Issue of the said *John Francis Lascelles* the said *Jane Hird* will acquire the absolute Control of the said Leasehold Premises, and considering that the Trustees of the said recited Will have recently paid the Sum of Three thousand eight hundred Pounds, Portion of the Sum raised by them from Time to Time since the Decease of the said *Matthew Butterwick* for the Purposes of Renewal of the said Leasehold Premises, it is not thought expedient to keep up the said Policies of Life Assurance after the Sale or Exchange of the said Leasehold Premises, and the Parties interested are desirous of disposing of the same, but the Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick* does not authorize or provide for such Sale: And whereas the herein-before mentioned Leasehold Premises and the Two earliest of the said Policies of Life Assurance are subject to certain Mortgage Securities which were, by an Indenture bearing Date the Twentieth Day of *February* One thousand eight hundred and forty-five, assigned and transferred to *John Hardy* the younger, *Charles Hardy*, *Gathorne Hardy*, and *John Wood*, their Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, and there is now due and owing to them by virtue thereof the Sum of Seven thousand Pounds, with some Interest thereon: And whereas the Sum of Six hundred and sixty Pounds was borrowed by the Trustees on or about the Twentieth Day of *March* One thousand eight hundred and forty-one of the said *Mary Lascelles*, since deceased, and was applied for a Renewal of the said Lease, and such Sum, with some Interest thereon, is now due and owing to the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* as her legal personal Representative: And whereas it is expected that the Money to be received on the Sale or Exchange of the said Leasehold Premises and Policies of Assurance will, after paying off and liquidating the said several Principal Sums of Seven thousand Pounds and Six hundred and sixty Pounds, so due and owing as aforesaid, produce and leave a considerable Sum available for Re-investment under the Powers of this Act: And whereas the said Indentures of Mortgage and further Charge do not contain a Power of Sale, and, under the Circumstances aforesaid, no Sale can be effected of the said Leasehold Premises and Policies of Assurance, or any of them, without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: Therefore Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects the said *John Francis Lascelles* and *Jane Hird*, and also the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck* (as such Trustees as aforesaid), do most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; (that is to say,)

Short Title. I. The Short Title of this Act for any Purpose to be "*Butterwick's Estate Act, 1856.*"

II. It shall be lawful for the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck*, or the Survivor of them, his Heirs, Executors, or Administrators, or other the Trustees or Trustee for the Time being of the said recited Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick* deceased, at any Time or Times after the passing of this Act, and from Time to Time, when and as it shall to them or him seem expedient so to do, to sell and dispose of the said Rectory, Tithe Rentcharge, and Premises specified in the First Schedule to this Act, and any other Premises comprised in the said Indenture of Lease of the Twelfth Day of *July* One thousand eight hundred and fifty, if any there be, which are now vested in the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck* upon the Trusts of the said Will, and also the said Policies of Life Assurance specified in the Second Schedule to this Act, or any of them, either by Public Auction or Private Contract, or partly in one Mode and partly in the other, with Power to enter into special Stipulations regarding the Evidence of Title or any other Matters connected with the said Sale, and also to buy in the said Premises or any Part thereof respectively at any Auction or Auctions, and resell the same, and likewise to rescind or vary any Contract for Sale; and on Payment of the Purchase Money of the said respective Premises hereby authorized to be sold as aforesaid it shall be lawful for the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck*, or the Survivor of them, his Heirs, Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, or other the Trustees or Trustee for the Time being of the said Will, to join and concur with the said *John Hardy* the younger, *Charles Hardy*, *Gathorne Hardy*, and *John Wood*, their Heirs, Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, or other the Person or Persons entitled to the Benefit of the herein-before recited Mortgage Security, and with the Person or Persons entitled to the Benefit of the herein-before mentioned Debt of Six hundred and sixty Pounds, in surrendering, conveying, assigning, and assuring the said Leasehold Premises and Policies respectively in such Manner as the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof respectively shall direct, freed and absolutely exonerated and discharged from all Trusts, Charges, Powers, and Provisoos created, limited, or declared in and by the herein-before recited Will and Codicil of the said *Matthew Butterwick* deceased, and the Claims and Demands of all Persons whomsoever deriving any Estate or Interest whatsoever under the said Will and Codicil, or either of them.

III. It shall be lawful for the said *Henry Wickham Wickham* and *Thomas Swarbreck*, or the Survivor of them, his Heirs or Assigns, or other the Trustees or Trustee for the Time being of the said Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick*, to dispose of the said Leasehold Premises, hereby made saleable, either wholly for a pecuniary Consideration in manner aforesaid, or partly for such a Consideration and partly in exchange for other Hereditaments held for an Estate in Fee Simple,

Simple, or wholly in consideration of such Exchange, as the said Trustees or Trustee for the Time being shall think proper; and the Hereditaments to be acquired by any such Exchange or Exchanges shall be conveyed and assured to the Use of the said Trustees or Trustee for the Time being, their, his, or her Heirs and Assigns for ever, upon such and the same Trusts, and for such and the same Ends, Intents, and Purposes, and with, under, and subject to such and the same Powers, Provisoos, and Restrictions, in all respects, as are in and by the said recited Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick* deceased limited, declared, and contained of and concerning the Leasehold Estate thereby devised, and hereby authorized to be sold or exchanged as aforesaid, or as near thereto as the Death of the Parties, the Tenure and Quality of the Hereditaments conveyed, and other Circumstances will permit; and the Conveyance or Assurance, Conveyances or Assurances, to be made by the said Trustees or Trustee for the Time being for the Purpose of carrying into effect any such Exchange or Exchanges as aforesaid, shall be as effectual to all Intents and Purposes as any Conveyance or Assurance which may be made under or by virtue of the general Power of Sale herein-before contained.

No Sale of Policies to be made until after Sale or Exchange of Leasehold Premises.

IV. No Sale shall be made of the said Policies or either of them until a Sale or Exchange shall have been effected of the said Leasehold Premises: Provided always, that until the said Policies shall be sold, the same shall be kept on foot out of the annual Income of the said Leasehold Premises, or of the Money arising from the Sale or Exchange thereof.

Application of Purchase Moneys.

VI. The Moneys arising from the Sale or Exchange of the said Leasehold Premises, and from the Sale of the said Policies of Life Assurance, shall be applied in manner following; (that is to say,) first, in Payment and Satisfaction of the Principal Sum and Costs, if any, due and owing to the said *John Hardy* the younger, *Charles Hardy*, *Gathorne Hardy*, and *John Wood*, their Executors, Administrators, or Assigns,

Assigns, as such Mortgagees as aforesaid; secondly, in Payment and Satisfaction of the Principal Sum and Costs, if any, due and owing by virtue of such Debt of Six hundred and sixty Pounds as aforesaid; and the Residue or Surplus of the said Moneys shall be paid into the Bank of *England* in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the High Court of Chancery, to be placed to his Account there *ex parte* "The Purchaser in the Matter of *Butterwick's Estate Act, 1856,*" pursuant to the Method prescribed by the Act of the Twelfth Year of the Reign of King *George* the First, Chapter Thirty-two, and the General Orders of the said Court, and without Fee or Reward, according to the Act of the Twelfth Year of King *George* the Second, Chapter Twenty-four.

VII. The Certificate or Certificates of the Accountant General of the said Court of Chancery, together with the Receipt or Receipts of One of the Cashiers of the Bank of *England*, to be thereunto annexed and filed therewith in the Register Office of the said Court of Chancery, of the Payment into the Bank of *England* of the Moneys hereinbefore directed to be so paid, shall from Time to Time and at all Times be a good and sufficient Discharge to the Person or Persons so acquiring the said Leasehold Premises and Policies respectively on any Sale or Exchange, and to their respective Heirs, Successors, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, for so much of such Purchase Money, or of such Money received on any Exchange, for which such Certificate or Certificates and Receipt or Receipts shall be respectively given; and after the filing of such Certificate or Certificates and Receipt or Receipts he and they shall not be obliged to see to the Application, or be answerable or accountable for any Loss, Misapplication, or Nonapplication thereof or of any Part thereof.

VIII. Out of the Money which shall be so paid into the Bank as aforesaid all the Costs, Charges, and Expenses preparatory to and attending the soliciting and applying for, preparing, and obtaining and passing this Act, or which may be incident or relating thereto, and also all the Costs and Expenses preparatory to and attending any Sale or Exchange hereby authorized of the said Leasehold Estate and Policies, and deducing a Title thereto respectively, and the Execution of the Trusts of this Act and incidental thereto and consequent thereon, so far as relates to the same Estate and Policies, and the Costs and Expenses of any Application or Applications to the Court under this Act, shall, in the first place, be paid and satisfied, and the Residue or Surplus of such Money shall, upon Petition or Petitions to be presented to the said Court of Chancery in a summary Way at any Time and from Time to Time by the Person or Persons who for the Time being would be entitled to the Possession of or to the Receipt of the Rents and Profits of the said Leasehold Estate, if

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the same had not been sold or exchanged by virtue of this Act, or by the Guardian or Guardians of such Person or Persons on his, her, or their Behalf, in case of Minority, by or under the Direction of the said Court of Chancery, in pursuance of an Order or Orders to be made upon such Petition or Petitions, be either laid out and invested by and in the Name of the said Accountant General in the Purchase of Three Pounds *per Centum* Bank Annuities or other Government Securities, or be invested in the Name or Names of the Trustees or Trustee for the Time being of the said Will at Interest on Real Securities in *England* or *Wales*, with Power for such Trustees or Trustee from Time to Time, under the Order and Direction of the said Court of Chancery, to be obtained on Petition as aforesaid, to call in, vary, or dispose of such Securities, and to re-invest the Moneys to arise by such calling in, Sale, Variation, or Disposition, at Interest on Real Securities of the like Nature, or to pay such Money again into the Bank in the Name and with the Privity of the said Accountant General, to be by him again laid out in the Purchase of Three Pounds *per Centum* Consolidated Bank Annuities or other Government Securities from Time to Time, and so from Time to Time as often as the said Court shall direct; and the Moneys so from Time to Time laid out and invested in Bank Annuities or other Government or Real Securities, or such Part thereof as may not be ordered by the Court of Chancery to be sold or called in for any of the Purposes in this Act in that Behalf mentioned, shall be and continue invested in some One or more of such Securities respectively until the same shall be by the said Court ordered to be sold or called in for any of the Purposes of this Act.

Dividends until Securities sold to be paid to Parties interested;

and Securities to be considered as in the Nature of Freehold Estate, and to be subject to the Trusts declared by the Will of Matthew Butterwick.

IX. Until such Annuities or Securities shall be sold or converted, in pursuance of any Order of the said Court, for the Purposes of this Act, or some or One of such Purposes, the Dividends, Interest, and annual Income thereof, or of such Part thereof as shall remain unsold or unconverted, shall from Time to Time, by Order of the said Court, be paid to the Person or Persons who for the Time being would be entitled to the Possession of or to the Receipt of the Rents and Profits of the said Leasehold Estate, if the same had been exonerated from the Mortgage Securities, and had not been sold or exchanged by virtue of this Act; and all such Annuities and Securities so to be purchased or acquired as aforesaid, and the Principal or Capital thereof, shall for all Purposes of Title and Transmission be deemed as of the Nature of Freehold Estate of Inheritance, descendible at Common Law, and shall be and be deemed to be subject to and impressed with such and the same Trusts, Intents, and Purposes, Powers, Limitations, Declarations, and Provisions, in all respects as are in and by the Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick* deceased declared, expressed, and contained of and concerning the said Leasehold

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hold Estate by this Act authorized to be sold or exchanged, or such of the same Trusts, Intents, and Purposes, Powers, Limitations, Declarations, and Provisions, as shall for the Time being be subsisting and capable of taking effect, or would for the Time being have been subsisting and capable of taking effect in case this Act had not been passed (save and except any Provision for or relating to the Renewal of any Lease).

X. In case any or either of the Sums of Money assured by the said Policies of Life Assurance shall become payable by the dropping of the Life before the same shall be sold and disposed of by virtue of this Act, the Sum or Sums of Money which shall be received in respect thereof shall be applicable, and shall be applied and disposed of in such and the same Manner in all respects as the Moneys arising from the Sale thereof would have been applicable, under the Provisions of this Act, if such Policy or Policies had been sold and disposed of by virtue thereof, and the Person or Persons paying the same shall be protected and indemnified in respect to the Application of such Sum or Sums of Money in like Manner as Purchasers are hereby declared to be protected and indemnified in respect of Purchase Moneys paid by them.

Provision for the Event of assured Life dropping before Sale.

XI. It shall be lawful for the said Court of Chancery, from Time to Time, upon Petition, to be preferred in a summary Way, to make such Orders as the said Court shall think fit for allowing, taxing, or settling all Costs, Charges, and Expenses herein-before directed to be paid, and all the Costs, Charges, and Expenses which shall be incurred by the Trustees for the Time being of the Will of the said Testator *Matthew Butterwick* in and about all Applications to and Proceedings in the said Court to be made or had in pursuance of this Act, and in investing the said Purchase Money, or the said Money to be received on any Exchange, or any Part thereof, and otherwise in carrying into execution this Act, and also from Time to Time to make such Orders as the said Court shall think expedient for the Payment of all such Costs, Charges, and Expenses as aforesaid out of the Moneys which shall be so paid into the Bank of *England* as aforesaid, or out of the Moneys arising by the Sale or Conversion of the Stocks, Funds, or Securities so to be purchased as aforesaid.

XII. Provided always, That in every Case when any Act or Thing is authorized or directed by this Act to be done or executed by the Guardian or Guardians of any Taker of the Stocks, Funds, and Securities under this Act who shall be an Infant, the same shall be done or executed by the Testamentary Guardian or Guardians, or the acting Testamentary Guardian or Guardians for the Time being of such Infant, or, if there shall be no such acting Testamentary Guardian, then

Provided always, That nothing in this Act contained shall defeat, revoke, annul, suspend, lessen, or otherwise prejudicially affect any of the Powers, Discretions, and Authorities respectively created and conferred by the said recited Will, except only so far as the same respectively may be defeated or affected by the Execution of any of the Powers by this Act created.

XIV. Saving always to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, and to all Persons, and Bodies Politic and Corporate, and their respective Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, (other than and except the said *John Francis Lascelles*, his Heirs and Assigns, and the Children of him the said *John Francis Lascelles* respectively, and the Heirs of their respective Bodies, and also the said *Jane Hird* and the Heirs of her Body, and also the Heirs and Assigns of the said *Jane Hird*, and also all and every other Person and Persons to whom any Estate, Right, Title, Charge, or Interest whatsoever in the said Leasehold Premises hereby authorized to be sold hath been devised or limited, or shall have descended or devolved, or shall descend or devolve, under or by virtue of the said recited Will of the said *Matthew Butterwick* deceased, or any of the Trusts, Limitations, Powers, or Provisions contained, limited, or created in or by the said Will, or any Conveyance made to the Uses or upon the Trusts thereof, subsequent to the Estates in Tail vested in the said *Jane Hird*,) all such Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Claim, or Demand of and in, to, or out of the said Leasehold Premises comprised in the First Schedule to this Act, or any Part thereof, as they, every or any of them, had before the passing of this Act, or could or might have had or enjoyed in case this Act had not passed.
