# Cap. 8.

An Act to provide for the vesting and Management of certain Funds held in trust by the Town Council of Aberdeen; and for other Purposes.

[31st July 1868.]

HEREAS various Mortifications and charitable and other Funds are held in trust by and are under the Management of the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the Royal Burgh of Aberdeen, or their Office Bearers, the Master of Mortifications, the Dean of Guild, the Master of Kirk and Bridge Works, the Master of Guild Brethren's Hospital, and the Treasurer of the said Burgh: And whereas certain Portions of the said Mortifications and Funds have been lent to the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council, or their Office Bearers, the Treasurer of the said Burgh, the Master of Kirk and Bridge Works, and the Dean of Guild, as specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed; and it is expedient that the Title to and Management of the said Mortifications and Funds, so far as now vested in or hitherto exercised by any of the said Office Bearers, should be transferred to and [Private.] vested

vested in the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council, and that the Feu Duties or Ground Rents payable or belonging to the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council, or their Office Bearers, specified in the said Schedule, should be vested in and held by the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council, in substitution of the said Portions of the said Mortifications and Funds respectively, and for the same Trusts, Uses, and Purposes as the said several Portions of the said Mortifications and Funds respectively are now held: And whereas certain Customs, called the Bell and Petty Customs, are leviable by the said Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council on Articles brought into the said Burgh for Sale or Consumption, and it is expedient that Provision should be made for compounding for the Payment of the said Customs and for the eventual Abolition thereof; but these Objects cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, as follows; that is to say,

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited for all Purposes as "The Aberdeen Town Council Act, 1868."

"Town Council."

2. In this Act the Expression "Town Council" shall mean the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the Royal Burgh of Aberdeen.

Mortifications and Funds transferred to Town Council.

3. On and after the Eleventh Day of November One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight the Mortifications and Funds specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed, and all Money, Property, Rights, and Obligations connected therewith, so far as now vested in the said Office Bearers of the Town Council, the Master of Mortifications, the Dean of Guild, the Master of Kirk and Bridge Works, the Master of Guild Brethren's Hospital, and the Treasurer of the said Burgh, or any of them, shall be and are hereby transferred to and vested in the Town Council, without any continuing or connecting Title or Investiture other than this Act, and shall be held by the Town Council for the same Trusts, Uses, and Purposes as such Mortifications and Funds are now held by the said Office Bearers or any of them; and the Management and Administration of the said Mortifications and Funds and the annual Revenue thereof shall be and are hereby vested in the Town Council.

4. On and after the Eleventh Day of November One thousand Feu Duties eight hundred and sixty-eight the several Feu Duties or Ground rested in Rents payable or belonging to the Town Council or their Office Council. Bearers specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed, and all Property, Rights, and Obligations connected therewith, shall be and are hereby vested in the Town Council, without any continuing or connecting Title or Investiture other than this Act, and shall be held by them in substitution of the several Portions specified in the said Schedule of the Mortifications and Funds therein mentioned, and for the same Trusts, Uses, and Purposes as such Mortifications and Funds are now held by the Town Council or their said Office Bearers or any of them; and the Town Council may recover and enforce Payment of the said Feu Duties or Ground Rents; and the said Feu Duties or Ground Rents shall and are hereby declared to be in full Payment, Satisfaction, and Discharge of the Principal Sums specified in the said Schedule lent from the several Mortifications and Funds therein mentioned to the Town Council, or the Treasurer of Aberdeen, or the Master of Kirk and Bridge Works, or the Dean of Guild, or any other Office Bearer of the Town Council.

5. The Town Council may from Time to Time sell the Lands and Investment Feu Duties or Ground Rents held by them for Trust or other Purposes, or any Part thereof, and shall lay out and invest the Proceeds of the Lands and Feu Duties or Ground Rents so sold, and any other Monies which may be in or may come into their Hands for Trust or other Purposes, in the Purchase of Lands or on Heritable Securities on Lands and Heritages in any Part of Scotland, or in the Purchase of Feu Duties or Ground Rents payable from or out of Lands and Heritages in any Part of Scotland, or in Government Stocks or Securities, or on Mortgages of the Town Council or the Harbour Commissioners or Police Commissioners of Aberdeen; and the Town Council may from Time to Time call up and realize the Sums to be laid out and invested as aforesaid, or any Part thereof, and shall reinvest the Sums so called up and realized in the Purchase of other Lands or Heritages or Feu Duties or Ground Rents, or in any of the Securities above specified; provided that when these Powers of Sale or Reinvestment are exercised by the Town Council, the Proceeds of the Property or Securities sold or realized, and the Lands, Heritages, Feu Duties, or Ground Rents or Securities in which the same are reinvested, shall be held by the Town Council for the same Trust or other Purposes respectively as

the

the Property and Securities sold and realized were held by the Town Council.

Rights under Mortifications saved.

6. Nothing in this Act contained shall prejudice, alter, or affect the Rights of any Person who is in the Receipt of or entitled to receive any Pension, Allowance, or Benefit from any of the Mortifications or Funds specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed, or who is or may be beneficially interested in the several Mortifications, Funds, Feu Duties, or Ground Rents specified in the said Schedule, or any of them, or the annual Revenue arising therefrom, or shall prejudice, alter, or affect any Rights which the Town Council or the Burgesses of Guild of Aberdeen may have in the said several Mortifications or Funds or in the said Feu Duties or Ground Rents as transferred by this Act.

Provision as to any Rail-way or Station within the Burgh of Aberdeen.

7. Any Railway Company having a Line or Station within the Burgh of Aberdeen, and any other Corporation, Company, or Person liable in Payment of the Customs leviable by the Town Council on Articles brought into the said Burgh, called the Bell and Petty Customs, may compound with the Town Council for the Payment of a fixed annual Sum in lieu of the Customs on Articles brought within the said Burgh, and such Compositions may be made in perpetuity, or for such Number of Years, and at such Rate and on such Conditions, as may be agreed on, and may be renewed from Time to Time, and the Town Council may abolish and cease to levy the said Bell and Petty Customs at any Time they think fit on a Substitute for the same being provided to their Satisfaction.

Saving of ARights.

8. Saving and reserving to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, and to all other Persons or Corporations, their Heirs and Successors, (other than and except the Town Council and their said Office Bearers,) all such Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Claim, and Demand whatsoever in, to, or out of the Mortifications, Funds, Feu Duties, or Ground Rents specified in the Schedule to this Act annexed as they or any of them had before the passing of this Act, or could have claimed or demanded if this Act had not been passed.

Expenses of Act.

9. All Costs, Charges, and Expenses of and incident to the preparing for, obtaining, and passing this Act, or otherwise in relation thereto, shall be paid by the Town Council out of the said Mortifications and Funds or the Revenues thereof.

10. This Act shall not be a Public Act, but shall be printed by the several Printers to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty duly authorized to print the Statutes of the United Kingdom, and a Copy thereof so printed by any of them shall be admitted as Evidence thereof by all Judges, Justices, and others.
