Cap. 35.

An Act for carrying into effect a Contract between Edward Gresley Stone and John Attwood Esquires for the Sale of the Coptfold Hall Estate in the County of Essex to the said John Attwood, and for investing the Purchase Money in other Estates, to be settled to the same Uses; and also for authorizing the Exchange of certain Lands and Hereditaments in the Counties of Worcester and Gloucester, devised by the Will of John Stone Esquire, deceased.

[21st June 1841.]

HEREAS John Stone late of Chambers Court in the Parish Will of John of Longdon in the County of Worcester, Esquire, deceased, Stone, 16th duly made and published his last Will and Testament in June 1810. duly made and published his last Will and Testament in Writing, bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and ten, and which was by him duly executed, and also attested in such Manner as by Law was then required for passing Freehold Estates, whereby, after directing Payment of his Debts, Funeral and Testamentary Expences, and Legacies, and giving Directions respecting the Renewal of any Life or Lives which at his Death might have dropped in all or any of his Copyhold and Lease-[Private.] hold

hold Estates, and also giving certain Annuities charged upon and issuing out of his Real Estates therein and herein after mentioned (but all which Annuities have since determined by the Death of the respective Annuitants), he gave, devised, and bequeathed to John Edward Dowdeswell of Lincoln's Inn in the County of Middlesex, Esquire, and the Reverend John Broome of Forthampton in the County of Gloucester, Clerk, their Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, all that his Manor of Hasfield and Fiddington in the County of Gloucester, with its Rights, Royalties, Members, and Appurtenances, also all that his Capital Messuage or Mansion House called Chambers Court, with the Buildings, Lands, and Premises thereto belonging, and all other his Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Farms, Buildings, Lands, Tithes, Hereditaments, and all and singular other his Premises, situate, lying, and being in the several Parishes of Longdon aforesaid, Eldersfield, Staunton, Corse, Ashelworth, Tewkesbury, Walton, Cardiff, Fiddington, Ashchurch, and Hasfield, or elsewhere in the Counties of Worcester and Gloucester, or either of them, and all other his (the Testator's) Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Tithes, Hereditaments, and Premises, whatsoever and wheresoever, whereof or whereto he was seised, possessed, or entitled, in Possession, Reversion, Remainder, or Expectancy, or had a Power of disposing by his Will, with their and every of their several and respective Rights, Royalties, Members, and Appurtenances, to hold such of the said Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Buildings, Lands, Tithes, Hereditaments, and Premises as were Freehold unto the said John Edmund Dowdeswell and John Broome, their Heirs and Assigns, and to hold such of the said Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Buildings, Lands, Tithes, Hereditaments, and Premises as were less than Freehold unto the said John Edmund Dowdeswell and John Broome, their Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, for and during all his (the said Testator's) Estate, Term, and Interest therein, to the Uses, upon the Trusts, for the Ends, Intents, and Purposes, and with, under, and subject to the several Powers, Provisoes, and Limitations therein-after limited, expressed, and declared, and herein-after in part mentioned, of and concerning the same; (that is to say,) as to, for, and concerning such of the said Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Buildings, Lands, Tithes, Hereditaments, and Premises as were Freehold, to the Use of his Son Edward Gresley Stone, and his Assigns, for the Term of his natural Life, without Impeachment of Waste, with Remainder to the Use of the said John Edmund Dowdeswell and John Broome, and their Heirs, during the Life of his said Son Edward Gresley Stone, upon Trust to preserve the contingent Remainders therein-after limited, and after the Decease of his said Son to the Use of the First Son of the Body of his (the said Testator's) said Son Edward Gresley Stone, in Tail, with Remainder to the Use of the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and all and every other Son and Sons of the Body of his said Son Edward Gresley Stone, severally and successively, according to their respective Seniorities, in Tail, and in default of such Issue to the Use of all and every the Daughter and Daughters of the Body of his said Son Edward Gresley Stone, equally between them, as Tenants in Common in Tail, with cross Remainders between them

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them in Tail, in the usual Manner, and in Default or Failure of all such Issue, to the Use of his (the said Testator's) Nephew James Davis Morris (Son of John Davis Morris of Fickenham in the County of Worcester), and his Heirs for ever; and as to, for, and concerning such of the said Testator's Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Buildings, Lands, Tithes, Hereditaments, and Premises as were less than Freehold, with their and every of their Appurtenances, in Trust for such Person and Persons, and for such Estate and Interest, and in such Proportions and Manner, and under and subject to such Powers, Restrictions, and Limitations, as were therein expressed, limited, and declared of and concerning the said therein-before devised Freehold Manors, Hereditaments, and Premises, or as near thereto as might be, and the Nature of the Tenures of the said several and respective Estates would admit of, to the end the said last-mentioned Premises and every Part thereof, with the Appurtenances, might be held and enjoyed and go along with the said Freehold Premises so long as might be, and the Laws of England would admit; and the said Testator (amongst other things) directed, that in case he should happen to die before his said Son the said Edward Gresley Stone should have attained his Age of Twenty-one Years, his said Trustees and Executors thereinafter named should, during his Minority, set and let his said Manor, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Buildings, Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises therein-before mentioned, and limited to him for his Life as aforesaid, and receive the Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof, and every Part and Parcel thereof, and pay, apply, and dispose of an adequate, ample, and sufficient Part thereof in the Education and Support of his said Son the said Edward Gresley Stone during his Minority, and Place the Residue of such Rents, Issues, and Profits out at Interest, either on Government or Real Security, until a proper and eligible Purchase or Purchases (in the Opinion of his said Trustees, to whose Judgment and Discretion he entirely submitted and confided the same,) of Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments (either Freehold, Leasehold, or Copyhold,) could be made; and as and when such Purchase or Purchases could or might be made, then he thereby directed his said Trustees to invest the Residue of such Rents, Issues, and Profits, with all Interest that might have been gotten for the same, in the Purchase or Purchases of any Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments in the Kingdom of Great Britain, either Freehold, Leasehold, or Copyhold, and which Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, when so purchased, he thereby willed and directed should be conveyed unto the said John Edmund Dowdeswell and John Broome, their Heirs and Assigns, to such and the same Uses, upon and for such and the same Trusts, and to and for such and the same Ends, Intents, and Purposes, and by, with, under, and subject to such and the same Powers, Provisoes, Stipulations, and Agreements, in every respect, as had been limited,. expressed, provided, and declared of and concerning the Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, and Premises, in and by that his Will given and devised to them, or as near thereto as the Deaths of Parties or other Contingencies would admit, as being the Testator's Will, and he thereby declaring, that

that all the Residue of the Rents, Issues, and Profits of his said Manor, Capital and other Messuages, Buildings, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Premises, (after such Deduction thereout for the Support and Education of his said Son as aforesaid,) and all Interest which might be made of the same, from the Period of his Decease in the Infancy of his said Son to the Time of his attaining the Age of Twenty-one Years, or dying, should be invested in such Purchase or Purchases of Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Premises as aforesaid, to be settled as therein-before is directed; and in the said Will are contained Powers for the Testator's Son the said Edward Gresley Stone, when in possession of the said Estates, or entitled to the Rents and Profits thereof, to appoint for the Jointure of any Woman he might marry, for the Life of such Woman, any of the said Hereditaments, or any Rentcharge issuing therefrom, not exceeding the annual Sum of Four hundred Pounds, to be in bar and Satisfaction of Dower and Thirds; and also, in case he should happen to have One or more younger Child or Children, to limit or appoint the said Hereditaments and Premises, or any Part thereof, to any Person or Persons, for the Term of One thousand Years, or any other Term or Number of Years, upon Trust, by Sale or Mortgage of the said Hereditaments, or otherwise, as therein mentioned, to raise the Sum of One thousand Pounds apiece for the Portions of all and every such younger Child or Children, payable as therein mentioned; and also to grant Leases of the said Premises or any Part thereof (except of the said Mansion House called Chambers Court) to any Person or Persons, for any Term not exceeding Three Years, in Possession, under the Restrictions therein mentioned; and the said Testator appointed the said John Edmund Dowdeswell and John Broome Executors of his said Will: And whereas the said John Stone the Testator departed this Life on the Fourteenth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and eleven, without having revoked or altered his said Will, leaving the said Edward Gresley Stone his only Child and Heir at Law: And whereas, shortly after the Decease of the said Testator, a Bill was filed in the High Court of Chancery, by or on behalf of his infant Son the said Edward Gresley Stone, against the said John Edmund Dowdeswell and John Broome, and others, for an Account of the Estate of the said Testator, and of his Debts, Funeral Expences, and Legacies, and for the due Execution of the Trusts of his said Will; and by the Decree made on the Hearing of the said Cause on the Second Day of July One thousand eight hundred and eleven it was referred to one of the Masters of the said Court to take such Account accordingly, and a Receiver was appointed of the Rents and Profits of the Testator's Real Estates: And whereas, by an Order made on the hearing of the said Cause on further Directions, bearing Date the Twenty-second Day of July One thousand eight hundred and twelve, it was declared that the Will of the said Testator John Stone was well proved, and that the same ought to be established, and the Trusts thereof performed and carried into execution, and it was ordered and decreed accordingly: And whereas the said $John\ Broome$ departed this Life in the Month of September One thousand eight hundred and nineteen, leaving the said John Edmund Dowdeswell, his Co-Trustee, him surviving, and no new Trustee has been since appointed

appointed in his Stead: And whereas the said Edward Gresley Stone was let into possession of the said devised Estates under an Order of the said Court, and there was then standing in the Name of the Accountant General of the said Court, in Trust in the said Cause, the Sums of One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three Pounds Twelve Shillings and Nine-pence Three per Centum Reduced Bank Annuities, and Thirty-six thousand five hundred and forty-nine Pounds Ten Shillings and Five-pence Three per Centum Consolidated Bank Annuities, arising from the Savings of the Rents and Profits of the said Testator's Freehold, Copyhold, and Leasehold Estates during the Minority of the said Plaintiff, and which, pursuant to the Trusts of the said Will, were to be laid out in the Purchase of Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments in the Kingdom of Great Britain, either Freehold, Leasehold, or Copyhold, upon the Trusts therein and herein before mentioned: And whereas the said Edward Gresley Stone intermarried with Susanna Shepherd Spinster on the Thirty-first Day of May One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, and by an Indenture of Settlement, made and executed previously to and in contemplation of such Marriage, bearing Date the Thirtieth Day of the same Month of May, and made or expressed to be made between the said Edward Gresley Stone of the First Part, the Reverend Henry Shepherd of Langleys near Colnbrook in the County of Buckingham, Doctor in Divinity, and the said Susanna Shepherd, then of the same Place, Spinster, (One of his Daughters,) of the Second Part, and Charles Thorley of Colchester in the said County of Essex, Esquire, Richard Van Heythuysen, then of John Street, Bedford Row, in the County of Middlesex, Gentleman, (since deceased,) Henry John Shepherd of Beverley in the County of York, Esquire, and Charles Oldakre of Pershore in the County of Worcester, Esquire, of the Third Part, he the said Edward Gresley Stone, pursuant to and in exercise of the Power or Authority to him in that Behalf given or limited by the said Will of the said John Stone deceased, did settle, limit, and appoint, upon and unto the said Susanna Shepherd, in case the said then intended Marriage should take effect, and she should survive him, One annual Sum or yearly Rent-charge of Four hundred Pounds, to be issuing out of and chargeable upon all and singular the said Freehold Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Farms, Buildings, Lands, Tithes, and Hereditaments in the Counties of Worcester and Gloucester, devised by the said Will of the said John Stone as aforesaid, and to be payable and paid to her the said Susanna Shepherd and her Assigns, for and during the Term of her natural Life, for her Jointure, and in full Recompence, Lieu, Bar, and Satisfaction of her Dower and Thirds, as therein mentioned, and with the usual Powers and Remedies, by Distress and Entry, and Perception of Rents and Profits, for compelling and enforcing Payment thereof when in arrear; and by the same Indenture of Settlement the said Edward Gresley Stone, in further Pursuance and Exercise of the Power or Authority given or limited to him for that Purpose by the said Will of the said John Stone, did limit and appoint all and singular the said Manors, Capital and other Messuages, Tenements, Farms, Buildings, Lands, Tithes, and Hereditaments thereby charged with the said annual Sum or yearly Rent of Four hundred Pounds, with the Appurtenances, [Private.] 10 **q**

tenances, unto the said Henry John Shepherd and Charles Oldaker, their Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, for the Term of One hundred Years, to commence and be computed from the Decease of the said Edward Gresley Stone, upon certain Trusts therein expressed and declared concerning the same Term, for the further and better securing and enforcing the due Payment of the said annual Sum or yearly Rent of Four hundred Pounds to the said Susanna Shepherd or her Assigns, when in arrear, as therein mentioned, and all Costs attending the same, and with a Proviso for Cesser of the said Term on Performance of the said Trusts: And whereas the said Edward Gresley Stone hath now Issue by the said Susanna his Wife Four Sons; (namely,) Edward Henry Montague Stone, Edgar Gresley Stone, Richard John Thorley Stone, and William Harry Stone, and no other Child: And whereas, on the Twentieth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, the said Edward Gresley Stone entered into a Contract with the Devisees and Trustees under the Will of Richard Vachell Esquire, deceased, for the Purchase of a Freehold Manor and Estate; called Coptfold Hall Manor and Estate, situate in the Parish of Margaretting in the County of Essex, and of other Freehold and Copyhold Lands and Buildings in the said Parish, and in the Parish of Chelmsford in the said County of Essex, then late the Estate of the said Richard Vachell, and which Purchase (having been ultimately approved of by the Master to whom the same was referred as a proper and beneficial Purchase wherein to invest a sufficient Part of the said Trust Funds, upon the Trusts of the said Will,) was ordered by the said Court of Chancery to be carried into execution, and accordingly, by Indentures of Lease and Release (duly settled and approved of by the said Master), bearing Date respectively the Thirtieth and Thirty-first Days of July One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, the Release being made or expressed to be made between Samuel Jones Vachell of Bromley in the County of Middlesex, Esquire, and Tanfield Vachell of Chelmsford in the County of Essex, Esquire, of the First Part, Horatio Vachell of Acris in the County of Kent, Esquire, of the Second Part, the said Edward Gresley Stone of the Third Part, and the said John Edmund Dowdeswell of the Fourth Part, in consideration of the Sum of Two thousand four hundred Pounds paid by the said Edward Gresley Stone at the Time of the said Purchase by way of Deposit, and which had been repaid him in pursuance of an Order dated the Eighteenth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, and in consideration of the Sum of Twenty-nine thousand four hundred and seventy Pounds, paid in pursuance of the same Order, by the Draft of the Accountant General on the Bank of England, as therein mentioned, and the Receipt thereof was thereby acknowledged, all that the Manor of Coptfold Hall otherwise Cold Hall, with the Appurtenances, in the said County of Essex, and also that Capital Messuage called Coptfold Hall otherwise Cold Hall, with the Houses, Barns, Stables, Buildings, Orchards, Gardens, and Appurtenances thereto belonging, and the Parcel of Land and Pasture Ground called The Park, adjoining the said Capital Messuage, inclosed with Pales, and containing by Estimation One hundred and sixty Acres (more or less), and also divers Freehold Messuages or Tenements, Farms, Closes, Lands, Woods, and other Hereditaments, situate, lying, and being in the Parishes

Parishes of Margaretting and Chelmsford in the said County of Essex, and in the now-reciting Indenture of Release particularly described, and set forth in the Schedule and Map thereto annexed, (all which Hereditaments are comprised and included in the First Schedule to this Act annexed,) were granted, released, and conveyed unto the said John Edmund Dowdeswell and his Heirs, to the Use of the said Edward Gresley Stone and his Assigns, for and during the Term of his natural Life, (but without Power to commit Waste, and so that he and they should be impeachable for Waste,) but with all such other Powers as in and by the said Will of the said John Stone were limited and declared of and concerning the Freehold Estates thereby devised as aforesaid; and from and after the Determination of the said Estate so limited in Use to the said Edward Gresley Stone and his Assigns for his Life, to the Uses, upon the Trusts, and with, under, and subject to the Powers, Provisoes, and Declarations to, for, upon, with, under, and subject to which the Hereditaments purchased in pursuance of the Directions contained in the said Will of the said John Stone as aforesaid ought to be limited, settled, and assured; and in the said Indenture of Release are contained Covenants on the Part of the said Samuel Jones Vachell and Tanfield Vachell to surrender into the Hands of the respective Lords or Ladies of the Manors of Chelmsford otherwise Bishops Hall, and Ging Margarett otherwise Margaretting, according to the Custom of the same Manors, a Customary Messuage or Tenement, and divers Lands and Hereditaments holden of the same Manors, and situate in the said Parishes of Chelmsford and Margaretting, with the Appurtenances, (which Customary or Copyhold Hereditaments are also comprised in the First Schedule to this Act annexed,) to the Use of the said John Edmund Dowdeswell, or his Nominee or Nominees, and his or their Heirs, to the Intent that he or they might be admitted Tenant or Tenants of the same Copyhold Premises at the Will of the respective Lords or Ladies, and according to the respective Customs of the same Manors, by and under the Rents and Services therefore due and of Right accustomed, and to be holden upon such Trusts as would best and nearest correspond with the Limitations therein-before contained of and concerning the Freehold, Hereditaments thereby granted and released, or expressed or intended so to be, and which Surrenders were afterwards duly made and perfected, and the said John Edmund Dowdeswell was admitted Tenant, to the said Customary or Copyhold Messuage, Lands, and Hereditaments, to hold to him and his Heirs, upon the Trusts aforesaid: And whereas by an Order of the said Court of Chancery bearing Date the Thirteenth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, and of the Master's Report in pursuance thereof, bearing Date the Seventeenth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, and of another Order of the said Court, bearing Date the Twenty-third Day of November One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, Two Customary or Copyhold Fields called Furze-hill Field and Brick Field, containing together by Estimation Seven Acres (more or less), held of the said Manor of Ging Margarett otherwise Margaretting, (being further Part of the Hereditaments comprised in the First Schedule to this Act,) were ordered and authorized to be purchased from William Payne, upon the Trusts of the Will of the said Testator John Stone, for the Price or Sum of Four hundred

hundred and fifty Pounds; and accordingly, at a Court held for the said Manor of Ging Margarett otherwise Margaretting, on the Fourth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, the said William Payne, in consideration of the Sum of Four hundred and fifty Pounds paid to him by the said John Edmund Dowdeswell, did surrender into the Hands of the Lord of the same Manor according to the Custom thereof the said Two Fields or Parcels of Land last herein-before mentioned and described, with the Appurtenances, to the Use of the said John Edmund Dowdeswell, his Heirs and Assigns, to be held of the Lord of the same Manor by the Rents and Services therefore anciently due and of Right accustomed, upon and for such and the same Trusts, Intents, and Purposes, and by, with, under, and subject to such and the same Powers, Provisoes, Restrictions, and Limitations, in every respect, as are in and by the said recited Will expressed, limited, or declared of or concerning the said Freehold Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, Hereditaments, and Premises thereby devised, or as near thereto as might be, and the Nature of the Tenure of the said Hereditaments and other Circumstances would admit of; and at the same Court the said John Edmund Dowdeswell was duly admitted Tenant to the said Hereditaments and Premises, with the Appurtenances, under and according to the said Surrender: And whereas by Articles of Agreement, bearing Date the Eleventh Day of December One thousand eight hundred and forty, and made and entered into by and between the said Edward Gresley Stone of the one Part, and John Attwood of Hylands in Widford in the said County of Essex, Esquire, of the other Part, the said Edward Gresley Stone (but subject to the Approbation of the High Court of Chancery in the said Suit there depending, and subject to the Approbation of the Trustees for the said Edward Gresley Stone under the Will of his late Estate, 11th Father the said John Stone deceased,) did agree with the said John Attwood that he the said Edward Gresley Stone; should and would sell to the said John Attwood all that the Manor of Coptfold otherwise Cold Hall, and also the said Mansion House called Coptfold Hall, together with all and every the Houses, Outhouses, Farms, Lands, and Estates of him the said Edward Gresley Stone in Margaretting aforesaid, or in any adjoining Parish or Parishes, (except Webb's Farm, therein-after mentioned,) late the Property of the before-named Richard Vachell deceased, being partly Freehold and partly Copyhold, and being the Hereditaments comprised in the before-mentioned Indentures of the Thirtieth and Thirty-first Days of July One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, and all the Copyhold Land of him the said Edward Gresley Stone then lately belonging to the beforenamed William Payne in Margaretting aforesaid, and all the Wood and Underwood, Rights, Members, and Appurtenances, to the same several Estates respectively belonging or appertaining, (and all which Estates are described and comprised in the First Schedule to this Act annexed,) for the Sum of Thirty-three thousand Pounds (excluding the Value of the Fixtures in and about the said Mansion House), and freed and discharged from all Incumbrances whatsoever, excepting the Land Tax, an annual Payment of Ten Pounds for Bread to be distributed amongst certain poor Persons, and the Quit Rents, Heriots (if any), Customs, and Services in respect of the Tenure thereof; and the said Edward Gresley Stone did thereby further agree with the said John Attwood, that he the said Edward Gresley Stone, and
