**The Petroleum-Spirit (Conveyance by Road) (Amendment)
Regulations 1966**

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 6 of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act 1928(a), both as enacted and as applied by the Petroleum (Mixtures) Order 1929(b), made under section 19 thereof, I hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 6 in Part II of Schedule 1 to the Petroleum-Spirit (Conveyance by Road) Regulations 1957(c), as amended(d) (which sub-paragraph provides, amongst other things, that the capacity of a tank wagon shall not, in any case, exceed four thousand gallons) for the words “four thousand gallons” there shall be substituted the words “six thousand six hundred gallons”.

2. In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 8 in the said Part II (which sub-paragraph provides that a carrying tank of more than eight hundred gallons capacity shall be divided into compartments no one of which shall be of more than eight hundred gallons capacity) for the words “eight hundred gallons”, in both places where those words occur, there shall be substituted the words “one thousand one hundred gallons”.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Petroleum-Spirit (Conveyance by Road) (Amendment) Regulations 1966 and shall come into operation on 28th September 1966.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

The Petroleum-Spirit (Conveyance by Road) Regulations 1957 provide that the capacity of a tank wagon used in the conveyance by road of petroleum-spirit (which expression includes certain mixtures of petroleum with other substances) shall not exceed 4,000 gallons. Under the amendment effected by these Regulations, the maximum permitted capacity is increased to 6,600 gallons. The Regulations of 1957 also require the carrying tank of a tank wagon of more than 800 gallons capacity to be divided into compartments, each not exceeding that capacity. Under the amendment effected by these Regulations, 1,100 gallons is substituted for 800 gallons for this purpose.

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
