The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in pursuance of section 12(4) of the Agriculture Act 1967(a) and all his other enabling powers, with the approval of the Treasury, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Beef Cow Subsidy Payment (England and Wales) Order 1967 and shall come into operation on 1st November 1967.

Interpretation

- 2.—(1) Unless the context otherwise requires, expressions used in this order have the same meaning as in the Beef Cow (England and Wales) Scheme 1967(b).
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amount of Subsidy Payment

3. Subject to the provisions of the Beef Cow (England and Wales) Scheme 1967, the amount which may be paid by way of subsidy payment under that scheme in respect of any eligible cow which on a prescribed date is comprised in a regular beef herd shall be £7 10s.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the order.)

The Beef Cow (England and Wales) Scheme 1967 sets out the conditions subject to which subsidy payments may be made in respect of cows comprised in regular beef herds.

This order prescribes that the amount of such payments for 1967 and each of the four following years shall be £7 10s. per cow.
