The Fees of Appointed Factory Doctors (Amendment)

Order 1968

Made - - - *5th November 1968*

Coming into Operation *15th November 1968*

The Secretary of State by virtue of her powers under section 152 of the Factories Act 1961^(a) and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order :—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Fees of Appointed Factory Doctors (Amendment) Order 1968 and shall come into operation on 15th November 1968.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889^(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Fees of Appointed Factory Doctors Order 1968^(c) shall have effect as if—

(a) after sub-paragraph (d) of Article 4(3) there were inserted the following sub-paragraph—

“(e) in the case of the Ionising Radiations (Unsealed Radioactive Substances) Regulations 1968^(d), fifty-three shillings for the first examination of any person for the purposes of those Regulations and twenty-six shillings and sixpence for any other examination of that person for the purposes of those Regulations ;”;

(b) in paragraph (d) of Article 5 after the expression “the Ionising Radiations (Sealed Sources) Regulations 1961” there were inserted the expression “or Regulation 32(1) of the Ionising Radiations (Unsealed Radioactive Substances) Regulations 1968”.
