EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order brings into force with effect from 29th November 1968 those provisions of the Gaming Act 1968 which relate to applications to the Gaming Board for Great Britain for certificates of consent, that is to say, the certificates which will be required before any application can, in due course, be made for a licence under that Act in respect of club premises used for gaming.

The Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965 (Commencement No. 2) Order 1968

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order appoints the day for the coming into operation of section 16 of the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965. The provisions of the Act, other than those of section 16, were brought into operation on 1st November 1965. Section 16(1) withdraws from the Secretary of State his power to award certificates of competency to teach. Section 16(2) has the effect of extending to teachers registered under the Teaching Council (Scotland) Act 1965 the procedure for dismissal prescribed by the Education (Scotland) Act 1962.
