The Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 13) Order 1968

> Made - - - 5th December 1968 Coming into Operation 6th December 1968

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 1(2), (4), (5), (6) and (7) of the Agriculture and Horticulture Act 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order :—

1. This order may be cited as the Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 13) Order 1968; and shall come into operation on 6th December 1968.

2-(1) In this order-

"the Principal Order" means the Price Stability of Imported Products (Levy Arrangements) Order 1966(b), as amended by any subsequent order and if any such order is replaced by any subsequent order the expression shall be construed as a reference to such subsequent order;

AND other expressions have the same meaning as in the Principal Order.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this order and the orders hereby revoked were Acts of Parliament.

3. In accordance with and subject to the provisions of Part II of the Principal Order (which provides for the charging of levies on imports of certain specified commodities)—

- (a) the rate of general levy for such imports into the United Kingdom of any specified commodity as are described in column 2 of Part I of the Schedule to this order in relation to a tariff heading indicated in column 1 of that Part shall be the rate set forth in relation thereto in column 3 of that Part;
- (b) the rate of country levy for such imports into the United Kingdom of any specified commodity as are described in column 2 of Part II of the Schedule to this order in relation to a tariff heading indicated in column 1 of that Part shall be the rate set forth in relation thereto in column 3 of that Part.

4. The Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 9) Order 1968(d) and the Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 12) Order 1968(e) are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This order, which comes into operation on 6th December 1968, supersedes the Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 12) Order 1968 and revokes the Price Stability of Imported Products (Rates of Levy No. 9) Order 1968. It :--

- (a) reduces to 10s. per ton the general levy on imports of maize (other than flat white maize and sweet corn on the cob);
- (b) reduces to 10s. per ton the country levy on imports of maize (other than flat white maize and sweet corn on the cob) which has been grown in and consigned to the United Kingdom from the United States of America;
- (c) reduces to £1 per ton the general levy on imports of denatured wheat ;
- (d) reduces to £1 per ton the country levy on imports of denatured wheat which has been grown in and consigned to the United Kingdom from Belgium, France, the Netherlands or Sweden and removes the country levy on imports of denatured wheat grown in the United States of America;

(e) retains the £5 per ton general levy on imports of maize meal; and

(f) retains the 5s. per ton country levy on imports of maize (other than flat white maize and sweet corn on the cob) which has been grown in and consigned to the United Kingdom from the French Republic.

The Clean Air Act 1968 (Commencement No. 1) (Scotland) Order 1968

Made - - - 4th December 1968

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 15(3) of the Clean Air Act 1968(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following order:—

1. This order may be cited as the Clean Air Act 1968 (Commencement No. 1) (Scotland) Order 1968.

2. The appointed day for the coming into operation of the provisions of the Clean Air Act 1968 specified in the schedule to this order in their application to Scotland shall be 1st April 1969.
