The County and Voluntary Schools (Notices) Regulations 1968

Made	10th April 1968
Laid before Parliament	23rd April 1968
Coming into Operation	24th April 1968

The Secretary of State for Education and Science, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 13(3) of the Education Act 1944(a) hereby makes the following regulations :---

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the County and Voluntary Schools (Notices) Regulations 1968 and shall come into operation on 24th April 1968.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Public notices

2. Public notice shall be given in the following manner of any proposals to which section 13(3) of the Education Act 1944 (public notice of proposals relating to schools) applies :---

- (a) by publishing the notice in at least one newspaper circulating in the area served or, as the case may be, to be served by the school;
- (b) by posting the notice in some conspicuous place or places within that area;
- (c) in the case of an existing school, by posting the notice at or near any main entrance to the school; and
- (d) in such other manner, if any, as appears to the authority or persons by whom the proposals were submitted to be desirable for giving publicity to the notice.

Revocation

3. The County and Voluntary Schools (Notices) Regulations 1945(c) and the County and Voluntary Schools (Notices) Amending Regulations 1953(d) are hereby revoked.
