The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, on the recommendation of the Board of Trade hereby make the following Order:—

- 1. Schedule 1 to the Import Duties (General) (No. 11) Order 1966(b) (which Schedule by reference to the Customs Tariff 1959 sets out the import duties chargeable under the Import Duties Act 1958) shall be amended in accordance with the Schedule to this Order.
- 2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (General) (No. 2) Order 1968.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
 - (3) This Order shall come into operation on 2nd May 1968.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order removes the import duty on certain plants and parts of plants primarily used in the production of medicinal preparations, and on gum euphorbium.
