The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with agriculture in Scotland and Northern Ireland, acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 1(2), (3), (4), (6) and (7) of the Agriculture and Horticulture Act 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the approval of the Treasury, hereby make the following order:—

- 1. This order may be cited as the Price Stability of Imported Products (Levy Arrangements) (Amendment No. 2) Order 1969, and shall come into operation on 17th November 1969.
- 2. The Price Stability of Imported Products (Levy Arrangements) Order 1966(b) as amended (c) shall be further amended by adding to the countries named in Schedule 2 thereto the following entries:—

"The Union of Soviet Socialist Republics The Hungarian People's Republic".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the order.)

This order amends the Price Stability of Imported Products (Levy Arrangements) Order 1966, as amended, by adding the U.S.S.R. and Hungary to the list of co-operating countries. The original order provides for exemption from any general levy for imports from co-operating countries.
