The Witnesses' Allowances (Amendment) Regulations 1969

Made--20th February 1969Coming into Operation10th March 1969

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 12 of the Costs in Criminal Cases Act 1952(a), I hereby make the following Regulations :----

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Witnesses' Allowances (Amendment) Regulations 1969 and shall come into operation on 10th March 1969.

2. Regulation 2 of the Witnesses' Allowances Regulations 1966(b), as amended(c), shall be amended by the substitution of the words "£10" and "£5" for the words "eight guineas" and "four guineas" respectively.

3. Sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (1) of Regulation 11A of the said Regulations shall be amended by the substitution of the words "£5" and "£4 6s. 0d." for the words "£4 12s. 6d." and "£4" respectively.

These Regulations provide for an increase in allowances to lawyers, doctors, dentists and veterinary surgeons called as professional witnesses and to registered medical practitioners for written medical reports to a court.
