The Schools (Amendment) Regulations 1969

Made - - - 24th February 1969

Laid before Parliament 28th February 1969

Coming into Operation 3rd March 1969

The Secretary of State for Education and Science, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3(4) of the Local Government Act 1958(a), hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Schools (Amendment) Regulations 1969 and shall come into operation on 3rd March 1969.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment to 1959 regulations

- 2. Regulation 12(1) of the Schools Regulations 1959(c) as amended (d) (leave of absence to undertake employment) shall have effect subject to the following amendments:—
 - (a) in sub-paragraph (b) for the reference to section 22 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933(e) there shall be substituted a reference to section 37 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1963(f); and
 - (b) at the end of the paragraph there shall be added—
 "or
 - (c) in accordance with a licence granted under section 25 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1933 as amended by section 42 of the Children and Young Persons Act 1963."
