The Import Deposit (Exemption) (No. 1) Order 1969

<i>Made - - - -</i>	<i>26th February 1969</i>
<i>Laid before the House of Commons - -</i>	<i>27th February 1969</i>
<i>Coming into Operation -</i>	<i>28th February 1969</i>

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the power conferred on them by section 2(4) of the Customs (Import Deposits) Act 1968(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Import Deposit (Exemption) (No. 1) Order 1969.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 28th February 1969.

2. There shall be added to Schedule 1 to the Customs (Import Deposits) Act 1968 (which lists the goods exempted from import deposit, classifying them in accordance with the Customs Tariff 1959) the following description of goods:—

Briar root blocks, within 98.11, roughly shaped by sawing but not further manufactured.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order adds briar root blocks, roughly shaped by sawing but not further manufactured, to the Schedule of goods exempt from the import deposit charged under the Customs (Import Deposits) Act 1968.
