

**1970 No. 1013****CUSTOMS AND EXCISE****The Anti-Dumping Duty Order 1970**

*Made* - - - - - 10th July 1970  
*Laid before the House of Commons* 16th July 1970  
*Coming into Operation* - - 17th July 1970

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sections 1 and 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969<sup>(a)</sup>, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping Duty Order 1970 and shall come into operation on 17th July 1970.

2. There shall be charged on the import into the United Kingdom of any goods of the description set out in the Schedule hereto (being goods classified in the Customs Tariff 1959<sup>(b)</sup> under the heading mentioned in the first column of that Schedule) a duty of customs at the rate mentioned in the third column.

3. Section 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969 (which allows relief to be given where goods are shown not to have been dumped or where the margin of dumping is less than the amount of the duty) shall apply to the duty imposed by this Order.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order imposes an anti-dumping duty of £5 per ton on ammonium sulphonitrate originating in the Federal Republic of Germany.

The Order applies section 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969 to the duty, which enables relief to be granted where particular goods have not been dumped or the margin of dumping is less than the amount of the charge.
