## COURT OF SESSION, SCOTLAND Act of Sederunt (Rules of Court Amendment No. 4) 1970

Made

15th July 1970

Coming into Operation

1st October 1970

The Lords of Council and Session, under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by section 2 of the Courts of Law Fees (Scotland) Act 1895(a) and section 16 of the Administration of Justice (Scotland) Act 1933(b) and of all other powers competent to them in that behalf, with the approval of the Treasury, do hereby enact and declare as follows:-

- 1. The Rules of Court (c) shall be amended by the deletion of Rule 341 and the substitution of a new Rule as follows:
  - "341. The fees charged by the Teind Clerk and by the Accountant of Court, or any officer acting for either of them, shall be collected in money. All other fees referred to in Rule 340 shall be collected by means of stamps. The collection of all such fees, whether in money or by means of stamps, shall be subject to the provisions of the Public Offices Fees Act 1879(d), and any amending Act, and in accordance with any regulations or orders made from time to time by the Treasury by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the said Act or Acts; and the officers named in this Rule and Rule 340 shall, each in his own department, be responsible for the observation of these regulations, and the collection of all fees specified in the tables, and, where appropriate, for the due cancellation of the stamps.
- 2. This Act of Sederunt may be cited as the Act of Sederunt (Rules of Court Amendment No. 4) 1970, and shall come into operation on 1st October 1970.

And the Lords appoint this Act of Sederunt to be inserted in the Books of Sederunt.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Act of Sederunt.)

This Act of Sederunt amends the Rules of Court by making provision for the payment of fees in the Teind Office and in the Department of the Accountant of Court in money instead of by means of stamps as heretofore.
