**The General Nursing Council for Scotland (Election Scheme)**

**Rules 1969 Approval Instrument 1970**

*Made* - - - 29th January 1970

*Laid before Parliament* 12th February 1970

*Coming into Operation* 13th February 1970

Whereas the General Nursing Council for Scotland have, in exercise of their powers under section 33 and paragraph 4 of the Schedule 1 of the Nurses (Scotland) Act 1951(a) made the General Nursing Council for Scotland (Election Scheme) Rules 1969 and have submitted the said rules to the Secretary of State for his approval:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 33(3) of the Nurses (Scotland) Act 1951 and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby approve the said rules in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

This instrument may be cited as the General Nursing Council for Scotland (Election Scheme) Rules 1969, Approval Instrument 1970 and shall come into operation on the 13th day of February 1970.

**SCHEDULE**

**The General Nursing Council for Scotland (Election Scheme) Rules  
1969, dated 28th November 1969, made by the General Nursing  
Council for Scotland**

The General Nursing Council for Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 33 and paragraph 4 of Schedule 1 of the Nurses (Scotland) Act 1951, and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as the General Nursing Council for Scotland (Election Scheme) Rules 1969.
2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) applies to the interpretation of these rules as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Sixth and Seventh Schedules of the Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1954 approved by the Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1954 Approval Instrument 1954(a) and Part VIII and the Sixth and Seventh Schedules of the Enrolled Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1961 approved by the Enrolled Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1961 Approval Instrument 1962(b) are hereby revoked:

Provided that such revocation shall not affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred, or anything duly done or suffered, under those rules.

4. The members of the General Nursing Council for Scotland who are required by the provisions of paragraph 1(a) of Schedule I of the Nurses (Scotland) Act 1951 as amended by section 3(1) of the Nurses Act 1969 to be elected in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 2 of that Schedule as substituted by subsection (2) of section 3 of the Nurses Act 1969, shall be elected in accordance with the Scheme set out in the Schedule to these rules.

## SCHEDULE TO THE RULES

### *Interpretation*

1. Unless the context otherwise requires, expressions used in this Scheme have the same meanings as in the Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1954 and the Enrolled Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1961 made by the Council under section 6 of the Nurses (Scotland) Act 1951.

### *Returning Officer*

2.—(1) The Council shall at least six months before the date on which their elected members cease to hold office appoint a person, not being a member or an officer of the Council, to be the Returning Officer for the ensuing election.

(2) The Council shall appoint a Deputy Returning Officer, not being a member or an officer of the Council, to act for the Returning Officer in the event of his absence or inability to act, and the expression "Returning Officer" in this Scheme includes the Deputy Returning Officer so acting.

(3) The Returning Officer shall have power, subject to the approval of the Council, to employ and pay out of the monies provided to him by the Council the staff necessary for the conduct of the election.

(4) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the Returning Officer shall be responsible for the conduct of the election.

### *Qualification of Candidates and Electors*

3.—(1) The numbers and qualifications of the several classes of persons to be elected are specified in the first and second columns of the following table, and the qualifications of the persons entitled to nominate and to take part in the election of candidates of each of these classes are specified in the third column of the table. Each of the nurses to be elected shall on the last date fixed for the receipt of nomination papers be engaged in Scotland in work for which the employment of a registered nurse or an enrolled nurse, as the case may be, is requisite or for which a registered nurse or an enrolled nurse, as the case may be, is commonly employed.

(2) In order to be eligible for election under this Scheme, a person must have the requisite qualifications on the date of nomination and on the date of the election. In order to be entitled to nominate for the election, a person must have the requisite qualifications on the date of nomination and in order to be entitled to take part in the election a person must have the requisite qualifications on the date of the election.

#### *Publication of Notice of Election*

4. The Returning Officer shall fix the last day on which nomination papers are to be received, and at least twenty-eight clear days before the day so fixed shall cause a notice of the election to be published, specifying the number and description of persons to be elected, the place to which the nomination papers are to be sent, and the last day on which they are to be received. The notice shall be, as nearly as may be, in the form marked A in the Appendix to this Scheme, and shall be published once in at least two recognised journals circulating among nurses, and in a daily newspaper published in each of the following places, namely: Edinburgh, Glasgow, Aberdeen and Dundee.

#### *Nomination*

5.—(1) Each candidate for election shall be nominated by a separate nomination paper signed by not fewer than two persons having the requisite qualifications for nominating the candidate. Nomination papers shall be obtainable from the Registrar on demand.

(2) A nurse shall not nominate a candidate for election by nurses holding a particular qualification unless she herself holds the requisite qualification specified in Rule 3.

(3) Each nomination paper shall state the name, address and requisite qualifications of the person nominated and also the addresses and requisite qualifications of the persons signing such paper, and shall be, as nearly as may be, in the appropriate form marked B in the Appendix to this Scheme.

(4) Any person having the requisite qualifications for nominating a candidate may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding the number to be elected.

(5) Every nomination paper shall, before twelve noon of the last day fixed for the receipt of nomination papers, be delivered by post or otherwise to the Returning Officer, General Nursing Council for Scotland, 5 Darnaway Street, Edinburgh EH3 6DP and shall be accompanied by a declaration in writing signed by the person nominated, in the form marked C in the Appendix to this Scheme or to the like effect, acknowledging that such person consents to be nominated and that the particulars are correct. Every nomination paper in respect of which any requirement of this Scheme has not been complied with, or which is not received by the Returning Officer before twelve noon of the last day fixed for the receipt of nomination papers, shall be invalid: provided that no misnomer or inaccurate or incomplete description of any person or place named in any nomination paper shall invalidate that paper if, in the opinion of the Returning Officer, the description of the person or place is such as to be commonly understood.

#### *Conduct of Election*

6. The election of the six persons to represent registered general nurses shall be conducted in the following manner:—

(1) If the number of duly nominated candidates does not exceed six, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare such candidates to be elected.

(2) If the number of duly nominated candidates exceeds the number to be elected, the Returning Officer shall cause ballot papers and identification envelopes to be prepared. Ballot papers shall contain the names, addresses and professional status of all the persons nominated, and state the last day on which ballot papers may be received, and the place to which they are to be returned, and the identification envelope shall bear a declaration of identity.

Ballot papers and identification envelopes shall be, as nearly as may be, in the forms marked D and E in the Appendix to this Scheme.

(3) The Returning Officer shall, twenty-one clear days at least before the last day fixed for the receipt of ballot papers, cause a ballot paper to be forwarded by post to each person qualified to take part in the election at her registered address, together with an identification envelope. Each elector shall be entitled to receive one ballot paper and one identification envelope, and no more, and votes shall not be given except upon the ballot papers provided by the Returning Officer.

(4) Each elector shall vote by marking the ballot paper delivered to her with a X against the name or names of the person or persons (not exceeding the number of persons to be elected), for whom she votes, and shall place her ballot paper folded face inwards in the appropriate identification envelope, and securely fasten the same. The elector shall sign the declaration printed on the said envelope, place it inside a covering sealed envelope bearing the address of the Returning Officer, and send it by post or otherwise to the Returning Officer. Every ballot paper in respect of which any requirement of this Scheme has not been complied with, or on which the elector has placed any mark whereby she may be afterwards identified, or which is not received by the Returning Officer before twelve noon on the last day fixed for the receipt of ballot papers, shall be invalid.

(5) The Returning Officer, immediately after the last day fixed for the receipt of ballot papers, shall cause the validity of the votes to be ascertained by an examination of the identification envelopes and by such other evidence, if any, as he may think necessary, and shall cause such of the identification envelopes as are found to be valid to be opened, and the ballot papers withdrawn, kept folded face inwards, and placed in a ballot box. When all the ballot papers have been transferred to the ballot box they shall be examined and counted, and the number of valid votes given for each candidate shall be ascertained. Any candidate, or agent appointed by her to represent her, may be present during the examination of the identification envelopes and the counting of the ballot papers.

(6) The six candidates having the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected by the Returning Officer. If an equality of votes is found to exist between any of the candidates, and the addition of a vote would entitle any of such candidates to be declared elected, the Returning Officer shall determine by lot which of the candidates whose votes are equal shall be declared elected.

(7) The foregoing provisions with regard to the conduct of the election of registered general nurses shall apply with the necessary modifications to the election of persons representing respectively registered mental nurses, registered nurses for mental defectives, registered sick children's nurses, registered nurse tutors and enrolled nurses.

#### *Powers of Returning Officers*

7.—(1) Any question arising with regard to the validity of a nomination or ballot paper, or otherwise in connection with any election held under this Scheme, shall be determined by the Returning Officer whose decision shall be final.

(2) No election held under this Scheme shall be invalidated by reason of misdescription or non-compliance with the provisions of this Scheme, or by reason of any mis-count or of the non-delivery, loss, or miscarriage in the course of post of any document required under this Scheme to be despatched by post, if the Returning Officer certifies in writing that the election was conducted substantially in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme, and that the result of such misdescription, non-compliance, mis-count, non-delivery, loss or miscarriage did not affect the result of the election; provided that any unsuccessful candidate or her agent may, within fourteen days after the declaration by the Returning Officer of the result of the election, appeal to the Secretary of State for Scotland against a Certificate given by the Returning Officer under this sub-paragraph, and the decision of the Secretary of State for Scotland shall be final.

(3) The Identification Envelopes and Ballot Papers shall be destroyed by the Returning Officer on the expiry of one calendar month from the date of the declaration of the result of the election, unless there shall have been an appeal as provided for under the immediately preceding sub-paragraph of this Scheme, in which event the Secretary of State for Scotland shall order the destruction of the said Envelopes and Ballot Papers, on the determination of the appeal.

#### *Notice and Publication of Result of Election*

8. The Returning Officer shall forthwith give to every person elected written notice of her election, and shall furnish the Council with a list of the persons certified by him to have been duly elected, showing the number of votes cast for each of such persons. The Returning Officer shall also publish the names and addresses of the elected candidates in the journals and newspapers specified in paragraph 4 of this Scheme.

#### *Secrecy of Ballot*

9. The Returning Officer, and every officer, clerk, or servant employed in connection with the election shall maintain, and aid in maintaining, the secrecy of the ballot, and shall not communicate to any person any information as to the manner in which any elector has recorded her vote.

### APPENDIX

#### Rule 4

#### FORM A (Notice of Election) NURSES (SCOTLAND) ACTS 1951 TO 1969

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to the Nurses (Scotland) Acts 1951 to 1969 an election of 14 members of the General Nursing Council for Scotland, 12 to

represent the nurses registered on the Register of that Council and 2 to represent the nurses enrolled upon the Roll of that Council, is about to be held.

The following table shows the numbers and qualifications of the persons to be elected and the qualifications of the persons entitled to nominate and take part in the election of each class of candidate. Each person to be elected shall, on the last date fixed for the receipt of nomination papers, be engaged in Scotland in work for which the employment of a registered nurse or an enrolled nurse, as the case may be, is requisite or for which a registered nurse or an enrolled nurse, as the case may be, is commonly employed.

In order to be eligible for election under this Scheme a person must have the requisite qualifications on the date of nomination and on the date of the election. In order to be entitled to nominate for election a person must have the requisite qualifications on the date of nomination, and in order to be entitled to take part in the election a person must have the requisite qualifications on the date of the election.

Each candidate must be nominated by a separate nomination paper. Any person having the requisite qualifications for nominating a candidate may nominate any number of candidates not exceeding the number to be elected.

Every nomination paper must state the name, address and requisite qualifications of the candidate nominated ; it must be signed by not fewer than two persons having the requisite qualifications for nominating the candidate ; and the address and requisite qualifications of each one so signing must be appended to his or her signature.

The nomination paper must be accompanied by a declaration in writing signed by the person nominated, acknowledging that he or she consents to be nominated and that the particulars are correct, and must be delivered by post or otherwise before the hour of twelve noon on the day of 19 , addressed to the Returning Officer, The General Nursing Council for Scotland, 5 Darnaway

Street, Edinburgh EH3 6DP. Every nomination paper which is not received at the address given above before the hour of twelve noon on the day of will be invalid.

Nomination papers may be obtained on application to the Registrar, The General Nursing Council for Scotland, 5 Darnaway Street, Edinburgh EH3 6DP.

In the case of Nurse Tutors, the nurses making the nomination must hold Certificates of Registration as Nurse Tutors. And in the case of Enrolled Nurses, the nurses making the nomination must be enrolled in the Roll of Nurses. Each nomination paper must be signed by not fewer than two persons having the requisite qualifications.

All nomination papers must be accompanied by a written declaration of consent by the person nominated.  
Nomination papers, should, except for the signatures of nominators, be completed in block capitals.

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#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of this Instrument.)*

These Rules supersede those which formed part of the Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1954 (in the Sixth and Seventh Schedules) and the Enrolled Nurses (Scotland) Rules 1961 (in Part VIII and the Sixth and Seventh Schedules).

The changes made take into account the alteration of the constitution of the General Nursing Council in the Nurses Act 1969.

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
