The Incidental Expenses (Scotland) (Amendment) Regulations 1970

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 91 of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962^(a) as amended by paragraph 29 of Part I of Schedule 2 to the Education (Scotland) Act 1969^(b), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Incidental Expenses (Scotland) (Amendment) Regulations 1970 and the Incidental Expenses (Scotland) Regulations 1959^(c) and these regulations may be cited together as the Incidental Expenses (Scotland) Regulations 1959 and 1970.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 21st December 1970.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889^(d) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of Incidental Expenses (Scotland) Regulations 1959

2. In regulation 2 of the Incidental Expenses (Scotland) Regulations 1959—

(a) the word “and” at the end of paragraph (6) shall be omitted;

(b) in paragraph (7) for the words from “provided that” to the end there shall be substituted the following words:—

“provided that such appointment is for service—

(i) in a school or further education centre situated in any of the following islands, namely, the Orkney Islands, the Shetland Islands, the Outer Hebrides, Colonsay, Tiree, Coll, Muck, Eigg, Rhum, Canna and Soay; or

(ii) as a teacher in any school, wherever situated, which is designated as seriously affected by a shortage of teachers by an education authority for the purpose of entitling teachers employed whole-time in that school to such additions to basic salary scales as may be provided in any memorandum published by Her Majesty's Stationery Office under section 2 of the Remuneration of Teachers (Scotland) Act 1967^(e), and for the time being in force under that section; and”

(c) after paragraph (7) there shall be inserted the following paragraph:—

“(8) in paying expenses incurred by the parent of any child in connection with any medical or dental inspection, or any medical or psychological examination, of that child, or by any young person in connection with any medical or dental inspection of that young person, under any provision of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

The Regulations list the distant islands to which Regulation 2(7) of the principal Regulations previously referred and enable an education authority to meet also the removal expenses of teachers moving into the authority's area to posts in schools designated by the authority as seriously affected by a shortage of teachers.

The Regulations also enable an education authority to reimburse expenses incurred in connection with medical and dental inspections or with medical or psychological examinations under the Education (Scotland) Act 1962.
