The Fixed Penalty (Procedure) (Amendment) Regulations 1970

<i>Made</i> - - - -	18th March 1970
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	31st March 1970
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	1st April 1970

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 80(11) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967(a), I hereby make the following Regulations :—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Fixed Penalty (Procedure) (Amendment) Regulations 1970.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) These Regulations shall not extend to Scotland.

(4) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st April 1970.

2.—(1) In Regulation 4(1)(a) of the Fixed Penalty (Procedure) Regulations 1970(c), after the words “the inner London area” there shall be inserted the words “or the Middlesex area”.

(2) Regulation 4(1)(e) of the said Regulations shall be omitted.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations provide that payment of a fixed penalty for an offence committed in the Middlesex area shall be made to the chief clerk at the Marylebone magistrates' court instead of to the clerk to the justices for the Brentford petty sessional division.
