**The Supplementary Benefit (Determination of Requirements)
Regulations 1970***Laid before Parliament in draft**Made* - - - 28th May 1970*Coming into Operation* 2nd November 1970

Whereas a draft of the following regulations was laid before Parliament and approved by resolution of each House of Parliament :

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State for Social Services, with the consent of the Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Ministry of Social Security Act 1966(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations :—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Supplementary Benefit (Determination of Requirements) Regulations 1970 and shall come into operation on 2nd November 1970.

(2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, “the Act” means the Ministry of Social Security Act 1966(a) and other expressions have the same meaning as in the Act.

(3) The rules for the construction of Acts of Parliament contained in the Interpretation Act, 1889(b) shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations as they apply for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of provisions for calculating requirements

2.—(1) Part II (calculation of requirements) of Schedule 2 to the Act (provisions for determining the right to and amount of benefit) shall be varied in accordance with the following provisions of this regulation.

(2) For paragraph 9 (normal requirements) and paragraph 10 (blind persons’ requirements) of the said Schedule 2, as varied (c), there shall be substituted the following paragraphs :—

Blind persons

10. Requirements of persons who are or include blind persons—

(a) husband and wife or other persons falling within paragraph 3(1) of this Schedule—

(i) if one of them is blind	9 15 0

(b) any other blind person aged—

(i) not less than 21 years	6 9 0
(ii) less than 21 but not less than 18 years	4 10 0
(iii) less than 18 but not less than 16 years	3 17 0

(v) less than 13 but not less than 11 years	2 4 0

(3) In paragraph 13(1)(b) of the said Schedule 2, as varied (a), (increase on account of rent of the amount specified for requirements where the beneficiary is a non-householder aged 18 or over), for “11 shillings” there shall be substituted “12 shillings”.
