## The Import Duties (General) (No. 8) Order 1971

*Made* - - - - - 22nd November 1971

*Laid before the House of  
Commons* - - - - - 26th November 1971

*Coming into Operation* - - - - - 2nd December 1971

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (General) (No. 8) Order 1971.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 2nd December 1971.

2. In Schedule 1 to the Import Duties (General) (No. 7) Order 1970(c) (which by reference to the Customs Tariff 1959 sets out the import duties chargeable under the Import Duties Act 1958), for sub-heading (B) of heading 20.04 there shall be substituted the following sub-heading:—

“(B) Cherries; fruit peels:

(1) Drained or glacé cherries	10%	C - E 10%
(2) Other	20%	C - E 20%”;

and the like amendment shall be made in Schedule 1 to the Import Duties (General) (No. 7) Order 1971(d) (which replaces the Import Duties (General) (No. 7) Order 1970 with effect from 1st January 1972).

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order reduces the full and E.F.T.A. rates of import duty on drained and glacé cherries from twenty per cent. to ten per cent. ad valorem.
