CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

The Anti-Dumping Duty (No. 5) Order 1971

Made - - - 23rd November 1971

Laid before the House of Commons 23rd November 1971

Coming into Operation 23rd November 1971

Whereas by the Anti-Dumping (Provisional Charge to Duty) (No. 4) Order 1971(a) which came into operation on the 24th August 1971, goods of the description set out in the Schedule hereto were made subject to a provisional charge in respect of an anti-dumping duty of £50 per ton:

And whereas the said Order remains in force:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State in exercise of his powers under sections 1, 2, 8(1), 9(3) and 15(4) of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969(b) hereby makes the following Order:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping Duty (No. 5) Order 1971 and shall come into operation on the 23rd November 1971.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order and the Order hereby revoked were Acts of Parliament.
- 2. There shall be charged on the importation into the United Kingdom of any goods of the description set out in the Schedule hereto (being goods classified in the Customs Tariff 1959(d) under the heading mentioned in the first column of that Schedule) a duty of customs at the rate set out in the third column; and the said duty shall be chargeable from 24th August 1971.
- 3. Section 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969 shall apply to the duty imposed by this Order.
- 4. The Anti-Dumping (Provisional Charge to Duty) (No. 4) Order 1971 is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order imposes an anti-dumping duty of £50 per ton on imports of chromic anhydride (also known as chromium trioxide or chromic acid) originating in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. The duty is chargeable retrospectively from 24th August 1971 (when such goods became subject to a provisional charge).

The Order applies to the duty section 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969, which enables relief to be granted where particular goods have not been dumped or the margin of dumping is less than the amount of the duty.
