The Local Government (Financial Loss Allowance)
Regulations 1971

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 112 and 117 of the Local Government Act 1948(a) as having effect by virtue of section 16 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1953(b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government (Financial Loss Allowance) Regulations 1971 and shall come into operation on 24th January 1972.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(c) applies for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Financial loss allowance

3. The amount which a member of a body to which Part VI of the Local Government Act 1948 applies shall be entitled to be paid by way of financial loss allowance within the meaning of section 112 of the said Act in respect of any one period of 24 hours shall not exceed—

- (a) where the period of time over which earnings are lost or additional expense (other than expense on account of travelling or subsistence) is incurred is not more than 4 hours, the sum of £2·37½
- (b) where the said period of time is more than 4 hours, the sum of £4·75.

Revocation

4. The Local Government (Financial Loss Allowance) Regulations 1970(d) are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

The Regulations supersede the Local Government (Financial Loss Allowance) Regulations 1970 and prescribe new maximum amounts for the financial loss allowance to which members of local authorities, etc., are entitled in respect of the performance of their duties.
