The Grant-Aided Secondary Schools (Scotland) **Grant (Amendment) Regulations 1971**

29th March 1971 Made

Laid before Parliament 7th April 1971

1st May 1971 Coming into Operation

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 75(c) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962(a) as set out in section 12(1) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1969(b), and by section 76(1) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Grant-Aided Secondary Schools (Scotland) Grant (Amendment) Regulations 1971 and shall come into operation on 1st May 1971.
- (2) These regulations shall be construed as one with the Grant-Aided Secondary Schools (Scotland) Grant Regulations 1959(c), as amended (d) (in these regulations referred to as "the principal regulations").

Amendment of the principal regulations

- 2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this regulation, the principal regulations shall be amended as follows:—
 - (i) for regulation 4 thereof there shall be substituted the following regulation:-
 - "4.—(1) Subject to the following provisions of this regulation and to the conditions prescribed in these regulations, the Secretary of State may pay to the Managers of a recognised secondary school in aid of their approved expenditure on the maintenance of the school in respect of each financial year of the school beginning after 1st April 1971 a grant of the amount specified in column (2) of the Schedule to these regulations opposite the name of the school in column (1) of that Schedule.

- (2) Subject as aforesaid, where it appears to the Secretary of State that, in relation to any financial year of any recognised secondary school beginning after 1st April 1971, an increase has taken place since October 1969 in the levels of prices, costs or remuneration which has affected expenditure incurred during that financial year in respect of that school on the maintenance thereof, he may pay in addition to the amount payable in relation to that school under paragraph (1) of this regulation, such increase in the grant for that financial year in respect of that school as he may determine: provided that the amount of such increase shall not (a) exceed an amount which in his opinion bears to the amount payable under said paragraph (1) the same proportion as the increase in the levels of the said prices, costs or remuneration obtaining in the said financial year bears to the levels of the prices, costs or remuneration affecting expenditure on the maintenance of the school obtaining in October 1969 and (b) taken with the amount payable under said paragraph (1) exceed the amount whereby the said approved expenditure exceeds the income of the Managers from sources other than grants after deduction from the said income of any sums approved as being required for purposes other than the maintenance of the school.
- (3) Subject as aforesaid, where it appears to the Secretary of State that, in relation to any financial year of any recognised secondary school beginning after 1st April 1971, the circumstances of the particular case justify him in so doing, he may in lieu of the amount payable in relation to that school under paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this regulation, as the case may be, pay such sum by way of grant for that financial year in respect of that school as he may determine: provided that the sum so determined shall not exceed the sum whereby the approved expenditure exceeds the income of the Managers from sources other than grants after deduction from the said income of any sums approved as being required for purposes other than the maintenance of the school.
- (4) A grant payable under this regulation may be paid by instalments of such amount and at such times as the Secretary of State may determine."
- (ii) for the Schedule to the principal regulations there shall be substituted the Schedule to these regulations.
- (2) Nothing in this regulation shall affect the payment of grant in respect of any financial year of a recognised secondary school beginning before 2nd April 1971.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations further amend the provisions of the Grant-Aided Secondary Schools (Scotland) Grant Regulations 1959, empowering the Secretary of State to pay to the Managers of secondary schools not managed by education authorities grants in aid of their expenditure on the maintenance of the schools.

The regulations re-enact the provisions of the 1969 amendment regulations regarding the payment to the Managers of each school, or group of schools, of the amounts specified in the third column of the schedule to those regulations. They also give the Secretary of State power to increase, within prescribed limits, the amount of grant in any year for a particular school, or group of schools, to take account of increases since October 1969 in the level of costs affecting the maintenance of the school.
