DEFENCE

The Certificates of Arrest and Surrender (Air Force) Regulations 1972

Made - - - 23rd February 1972
Coming into Operation In accordance with
Regulation 1

The Secretary of State for Defence, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 189(4) of the Air Force Act 1955(a) and, by virtue of section 44(2) of the Armed Forces Act 1971(b), by section 190A(4) of the Air Force Act 1955, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Certificates of Arrest and Surrender (Air Force) Regulations 1972 and shall come into operation on such date as the Armed Forces Act 1971 comes into force.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2. Where, in pursuance of section 187 of the Air Force Act 1955, a court of summary jurisdiction has dealt with a person as illegally absent, the certificate which is required by section 189(1) of that Act to be handed over with that person when he is delivered into air-force custody shall be in the form specified in Part I of the Schedule to these Regulations and shall contain the particulars therein set out as to his arrest or surrender and the proceedings before the court.
- 3. Where, under section 188 of the Air Force Act 1955, a person is delivered into air-force custody without being brought before a court the certificate which is required by section 189(2) of that Act to be handed over with him shall be in the form specified in Part II of the Schedule to these Regulations and shall contain the particulars therein set out relating to his surrender.
- 4. Where, in pursuance of section 190A of the Air Force Act 1955, a person suspected of any offence under Part II of that Act has been arrested under a warrant issued by his commanding officer, the certificate which is required by sub-section (3) of that section to be handed over with that person when

he is delivered into air-force custody shall be in the form specified in Part III of the Schedule to these Regulations and shall contain the particulars therein set out relating to his arrest and state whether or not the person arrested was at the time of arrest wearing the uniform of any of Her Majesty's air forces.

5. The Certificates of Arrest and Surrender of Deserters and Absentees (Air Force) Regulations 1956(a) and the Certificates of Arrest and Surrender of Deserters and Absentees (Air Force) (Amendment) Regulations 1961(b) are hereby revoked.

The following persons are authorised to sign under section 30 of the Army and Air Force Act 1961:—

- (1) in England, Wales and the Isle of Man, a justice of the peace or the clerk of the court;
- (2) in Scotland, the clerk of the court;
- (3) in Northern Ireland, a resident magistrate or the clerk of petty sessions for the petty sessions district in which the court sat;
- (4) in Jersey and Guernsey, a magistrate or a person for the time being authorised to act as a magistrate;
- (5) in Alderney, the chairman of the Court of Alderney or the person for the time being authorised to act as chairman of that court;
- (6) in Sark, the Seneschal or the Deputy Seneschal; and
- (7) in a colony, protectorate or trusteeship territory under the United Nations, a magistrate or the official (by whatever designation known) who exercises in the court functions similar to those exercised in England by the clerk of a court of summary jurisdiction.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations, which replace the Certificates of Arrest and Surrender of Deserters and Absentees (Air Force) Regulations 1956, prescribe the forms of certificate which must be handed over with a person who is delivered into air-force custody, being a deserter or absentee from the Air Force who has been brought before a court of summary jurisdiction or who has surrendered himself to the police or a person suspected of any offence under Part II of the Air Force Act 1955 who has been arrested under a warrant issued by his commanding officer.
