## The Anti-Dumping Duty Order 1972

<i>Made</i>	- - -	11th April 1972
<i>Laid before the House of Commons</i>		17th April 1972
<i>Coming into Operation</i>		18th April 1972

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 1 and 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969(a), hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping Duty Order 1972 and shall come into operation on 18th April 1972.

2. There shall be charged on the import into the United Kingdom of any goods of the description set out in the Schedule hereto (being goods classified in the Customs Tariff 1959(b) under the heading mentioned in the first column of that Schedule) a duty of customs at the rate mentioned in the third column.

3. Section 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969 (which allows relief to be given where goods are shown not to have been dumped or where the margin of dumping is less than the amount of the duty) shall apply to the duty imposed by this Order.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order)*

This Order imposes an anti-dumping duty of £62 per tonne on imports of unwrought magnesium originating in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.

The Order applies section 2 of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969 to the duty. This section enables relief to be granted where particular goods have not been dumped or the margin of dumping is shown to be less than the amount of duty payable.
