The Hill Cattle (Scotland) Amendment Scheme 1972

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 13 and 17 of the Hill Farming Act 1946(a) and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and with the approval of the Treasury, I hereby make the following scheme:—

Citation and commencement

1. This scheme may be cited as the Hill Cattle (Scotland) Amendment Scheme 1972 and shall come into operation on 2nd June 1972.

Interpretation

2.—(1) This scheme shall be construed as one with the Hill Cattle (Scotland) Scheme 1968(b) (hereinafter referred to in this scheme as “the principal scheme”) as amended(c).

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of this scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Variation of principal scheme

3. In paragraph 4(2) of the principal scheme for the sum of “£5” there shall be substituted the sum of “£5.75”.

4. Nothing in this scheme shall affect the amount of any subsidy payment which may be payable under the principal scheme as amended in respect of the years 1968 to 1971 inclusive notwithstanding the date of payment thereof.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Scheme.)

The Hill Cattle (Scotland) Scheme 1968 sets out the conditions on which subsidy payments may be made in the year 1968 and each of the next four years in respect of breeding cows grazed and maintained on hill land in Scotland, and in particular in paragraph 4 provides for the subsidy payment on a cow which does not qualify for a winter keep headage supplement under the Scheme of 1968 to be reduced by £5.

Increased rates of subsidy payment for the year 1972 are introduced under the Hill Cattle Subsidy Payment (Scotland) Order 1972 (S.I. 1972/726) made on the same date as this Scheme. These increased rates include a winter keep headage supplement of £5.75.

This Scheme provides for the corresponding increase in the reduction authorised by paragraph 4 of the Scheme of 1968.
