**The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 5) Order
1973**

<i>Made - - - -</i>	<i>6th March 1973</i>
<i>Laid before the House of Commons</i>	<i>7th March 1973</i>
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	<i>8th March 1973</i>

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by sections 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State(b), hereby make the following Order :—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 5) Order 1973.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 8th March 1973.

2.—(1) Until the beginning of 1st January 1974 or, in the case of goods in relation to which an earlier day is specified in the Schedule to this Order, until the beginning of that day, any import duty which is for the time being chargeable on goods of a heading of the Customs Tariff 1959 specified in that Schedule shall not be chargeable in respect of goods of any description there specified in relation to that heading.

(2) An entry in column 2 in the Schedule to this Order shall be taken to comprise all goods which would be classified under an entry in the same terms constituting a subheading (other than the final subheading) in the relevant heading of the Customs Tariff 1959.

3. For the purposes of classification under the Customs Tariff 1959, in so far as that depends on the rate of duty, any goods to which Article 2 or Article 3 above applies shall be treated as chargeable with the same duty as if this Order had not been made.

GOODS TEMPORARILY EXEMPT FROM IMPORT DUTY

28.18	Magnesium oxide, dead-burned but not fused, of a purity not less than 95 per cent., which contains— (a) not more than 0.05 per cent. by weight of boron compounds expressed as B_2O_3 (b) not more than 3.5 per cent. by weight of calcium compounds expressed as CaO (c) not more than 1.0 per cent. by weight of silicon compounds expressed as SiO_2 and (d) a total of not more than 0.5 per cent. by weight of aluminium compounds and iron compounds expressed as Al_2O_3 and Fe_2O_3
29.06	2-tertButyl-4-ethylphenol (until 3 July 1973)
39.07	Pallet legs of moulded polyethylene, being of a conical flower-pot shape, with double flange around the top opening and having a height of 11 centimetres and external diameters of 16 centimetres and 6 centimetres across the top and bottom respectively (until 3 May 1973)
54.01	Flax sliver (until 3 May 1973)
73.12	Strip of iron or steel, coated with tin, of a width not less than 304 millimetres and not more than 500 millimetres, of a thickness of not less than 0.12 millimetre and not more than 0.5 millimetre, and of a length of not more than 1016 millimetres (until 31st May 1973) Strip of iron or steel, in coil form, coated with tin, of a width of not less than 140 millimetres, and not more than 500 millimetres and of a thickness of not less than 0.12 millimetre and not more than 0.5 millimetre (until 31st May 1973)
73.13	Sheets of iron or steel, coated with tin, of a width exceeding 500 millimetres but not more than 966 millimetres, of a thickness of not less than 0.12 millimetre and not more than 0.5 millimetre and of a length of not more than 1016 millimetres (until 31st May 1973) Sheets of iron or steel, in coil form, coated with tin, of a width exceeding 500 millimetres but not more than 966 millimetres and of a thickness of not less than 0.12 millimetre and not more than 0.5 millimetre (until 31st May 1973)
73.18	Longitudinally double welded linepipe in lengths of not less than 11 metres and not more than 13.5 metres with an outside diameter of not less than 809.6 millimetres and not more than 816.0 millimetres and a wall thickness of not less than 18.10 millimetres and not more than 20.96 millimetres containing not more than 0.14 per cent. by weight of carbon, not more than 1.5 per cent. by weight of manganese, not more than 0.015 per cent. by weight of sulphur with a yield strength of not less than 45.7 Kg/mm ² and not more than 59.8 Kg/mm ² in a direction transverse to the pipe axis and a Charpy V notch value at minus 10 C of not less than 61 joule in parent material with the specimen length orientated in a direction transverse to the pipe axis (until 31 March 1973)

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order provides that the goods listed in the Schedule shall be temporarily exempt from import duty until 1st January 1974 or such earlier day as is specified.

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
