CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 6) Order 1973

Made - - - 22nd March 1973

*Laid before the House
of Commons* 23rd March 1973

Coming into Operation 27th March 1973

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by sections 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State(b), hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 6) Order 1973.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into operation on 27th March 1973.

2.—(1) The period for which, by virtue of the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 1) Order 1973(d), certain longitudinally double welded linepipe falling within heading 73.18 of the Customs Tariff 1959 and of a description set out in Schedule 1 hereto is exempt from import duty shall be extended until the beginning of 1st May 1973.

(2) Until the beginning of 3rd July 1973, or, in the case of goods in relation to which an earlier day is specified in Schedule 2 hereto, until the beginning of that day, any import duty which is for the time being chargeable on goods of a heading of the Customs Tariff 1959 specified in that Schedule shall not be chargeable in respect of goods of any description there specified in relation to that heading.

(3) Any entry in column 2 in Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 hereto shall be taken to comprise all goods which would be classified under an entry in the same terms constituting a subheading (other than the final subheading) in the relevant heading in the Customs Tariff 1959.

(4) For the purposes of classification under the Customs Tariff 1959, in so far as that depends on the rate of duty, any goods to which paragraph (1) or (2) above applies shall be treated as chargeable with the same duty as if this Order had not been made.

SCHEDULE 1

GOODS FOR WHICH EXEMPTION FROM IMPORT DUTY IS EXTENDED

<i>Tariff heading</i>	<i>Description</i>
73·18	Longitudinally double welded linepipe in lengths of not less than 9·14 metres and not more than 13·11 metres with an outside diameter of not less than 911·2 millimetres and not more than 917·6 millimetres and a wall thickness of not less than 15·08 millimetres and not more than 17·46 millimetres containing not more than 0·14 per cent. by weight of carbon, not more than 1·5 per cent. by weight of manganese, not more than 0·015 per cent. by weight of sulphur with a yield strength of not less than 42·2 Kg/mm ² and not more than 59·8 Kg/mm ² in a direction transverse to the pipe axis and a Charpy V notch value at minus 10°C of not less than 61 joule in parent material with the specimen length orientated in a direction transverse to the pipe axis.

SCHEDULE 2

GOODS TEMPORARILY EXEMPT FROM IMPORT DUTY

<i>Tariff heading</i>	<i>Description</i>
28·40	<i>di</i> Sodium dihydrogen pyrophosphate (until 3rd May 1973)
29·01	Ethylene (until 3rd July 1973) Styrene (until 3rd May 1973)
29·14	Undec-10-enoic acid which freezes at a temperature not lower than 23° centigrade (until 3rd May 1973)

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order continues, until 1st May 1973, the temporary exemption from import duty of certain longitudinally double welded linepipe. This Order also provides that the goods listed in Schedule 2 shall be temporarily exempt from import duty until 3rd July 1973 or, in the case of certain items, until such earlier day as is specified.
