**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The Trunk Road (West Hendon Broadway, Barnet)  
(Prescribed Route) Order 1974**

*Made - - - 2nd September 1974*  
*Coming into Operation 11th September 1974*

The Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967(a), as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968(b), and now vested in him (c), and of all other enabling powers, and after consulting the Secretary of State for the Home Department, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trunk Road (West Hendon Broadway, Barnet) (Prescribed Route) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 11th September 1974.

2.—(1) In this Order:—

“West Hendon Broadway” means that length of the London–Holyhead Trunk Road (A5) in the London Borough of Barnet known as West Hendon Broadway (Edgware Road);

“North Circular Road” means that length of the London North Circular Trunk Road (A406) in the said London Borough known as North Circular Road; and

“central reservation” means the provision made in West Hendon Broadway between a point immediately north of its junction with North Circular Road and a point 255 feet south-east of its junction with the south-eastern kerbline of Cool Oak Lane, for separating a part of the carriageway which is to be used by traffic proceeding in a north-westerly direction from a part of the carriageway which is to be used by traffic proceeding in the opposite direction.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. No person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in the south-western carriageway of West Hendon Broadway to turn into the north-eastern carriageway of West Hendon Broadway at the north-western end of the central reservation so as to proceed in the opposite direction to that in which it was proceeding.

4. Nothing in this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden.
