POISONS**The Poisons List (No. 2) Order 1974***Made* - - - 15th September 1974*Laid before Parliament* 19th September 1974*Coming into Operation* 1st November 1974

Whereas the Poisons Board has recommended to me that the list of substances which are to be treated as poisons for the purposes of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act 1933(a) should be amended so that an additional substance should be included in Part II of the said list (which Part specifies those poisons which, subject to the provisions of the said Act, are not to be sold except by a person who is an authorised seller of poisons or whose name is entered in a local authority's list):

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 17(5) of the said Act, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Poisons List (No. 2) Order 1974 and shall come into operation on 1st November 1974.

2. The Poisons List (b) shall be amended and varied as follows, that is to say, in Part II, after the item beginning with the word "Diamines" there shall be inserted the item "β-[2-(3,5-Dimethyl-2-oxocyclohexyl)-2-hydroxyethyl] glutarimide".
