**The Wages Regulation (Licensed Non-residential
Establishment) (Managers and Club Stewards)
(Amendment) Order 1974**

Made - - - - 14th October 1974

Coming into Operation 5th November 1974

Whereas the Secretary of State has received from the Licensed Non-residential Establishment Wages Council the wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State in exercise of powers conferred by section 11 of the Wages Councils Act 1959(a), and now vested in him (b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Wages Regulation (Licensed Non-residential Establishment) (Managers and Club Stewards) (Amendment) Order 1974.

2.—(1) In this Order the expression “the specified date” means the 5th November 1974, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression “the specified date” means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto shall have effect as from the specified date.

SCHEDULE

The Wages Regulation (Licensed Non-residential Establishment) (Managers and Club Stewards) Order 1974(a) (Order L.N.R. (102)), shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto:—

1. after paragraph 6 there were inserted the following additional paragraph:—

“COST OF LIVING PAYMENT

6A.—(1) In addition to the minimum remuneration specified in paragraphs 1, 5 and 6 of this Schedule additional remuneration, hereinafter referred to as the ‘cost of living payment’ shall, in accordance with this paragraph, be payable to all workers to whom those paragraphs apply.

(2) (a) The cost of living payment payable in respect of each complete pay week shall be £2.80;

(b) up to and including 15th November 1974, for each increase of 1.85 points above 209.5 in the Retail Price Index figure published by the Department of Employment the cost of living payment in respect of each complete pay week under (a) of this sub-paragraph shall be increased by 40p; and the payments referred to in this sub-paragraph shall be payable from the first complete pay week following the publication of such Retail Price Index figure.

(3) On and after 16th November 1974, the cost of living payment to be payable under this paragraph shall be that which was payable in respect of the last complete pay week before that date.

(4) Where a worker to whom paragraph 7 of this Schedule applies is supplied by his employer with full board (as defined in paragraph 26) during any week in respect of which a cost of living payment is payable to him under this paragraph that payment shall be reduced by 15p for each 40p of such payment.”

2. after paragraph 15 there were inserted the following additional paragraph:—

“15A.—(1) In addition to the minimum remuneration specified in paragraphs 10, 14 and 15 of this Schedule additional remuneration, hereinafter referred to as the ‘cost of living payment’ shall, in accordance with this paragraph, be payable to all workers to whom those paragraphs apply.

(2) (a) The cost of living payment payable in respect of each complete pay week shall be:—

(i) £2.80 in the case of a worker to whom paragraph 10 applies;

(ii) 7p multiplied by the number of hours, up to a maximum of 40 hours, worked in the relevant week in the case of a worker to whom paragraph 14 or 15 applies;

(b) up to and including 15th November 1974, for each increase of 1.85 points above 209.5 in the Retail Price Index figure published by the Department of Employment, the cost of living payment in respect of each complete pay week under (a) of this sub-paragraph shall be increased by:—

(i) 40p in the case of a worker to whom (a)(i) of this sub-paragraph applies;

(ii) 1p multiplied by the number of hours, up to a maximum of 40 hours, worked by him in a week in the case of a worker to whom (a)(ii) of this sub-paragraph applies;

and the payments referred to in this sub-paragraph shall be payable from the first complete pay week following the publication of such Retail Price Index figure.

(3) On and after 16th November 1974, the cost of living payment to be payable under this paragraph shall be that which was payable in respect of the last complete pay week before that date.

(4) The cost of living payment shall not be treated as part of the minimum weekly remuneration for the purpose of calculating payment for overtime under paragraph 13 of this Schedule.

(5) Where a worker to whom paragraph 16 of this Schedule applies, is supplied by his employer with full board (as defined in paragraph 26) during any week in respect of which a cost of living payment is payable to him under this paragraph, that payment shall be reduced by 15p for each 40p of such payment."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, which has effect from 5th November 1974, amends the Wages Regulation (Licensed Non-residential Establishment) (Managers and Club Stewards) Order 1974 (Order L.N.R. (102)) by providing for cost of living payments to be made to workers in relation to whom the Licensed Non-residential Establishment Wages Council operates.

New provisions are printed in italics.
