The Milk (Great Britain) (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1974

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State, acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 6 and 7 of the Emergency Laws (Re-enactments and Repeals) Act 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Milk (Great Britain) (Amendment) (No. 3) Order 1974, and shall come into operation on 3rd November 1974.

Amendment of the principal order

2. The Milk (Great Britain) Order 1971(b) as amended (c) shall be further amended by substituting for Schedules 1 and 2 thereto respectively Schedules 1 and 2 to this order.

SCHEDULE 1

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF MILK IN ENGLAND AND WALES

1. Subject to the provisions of this Schedule, the maximum price of milk on a sale by retail in England and Wales shall be a price in accordance with the following table:—

Milk	Maximum Price (Rate per Pint)
Channel Islands milk	p 6½
South Devon milk	6½
Untreated Milk Farm Bottled	6
Ultra Heat Treated milk	5½
Sterilised milk	5½
Homogenised milk	5½
Untreated milk	5
Pasteurised milk	5
Milk, other than the above mentioned	5

2. A reasonable charge may be made by the seller in addition to the appropriate maximum price specified in the above table for milk sold by him as Kosher or Kedassia milk if—

- (a) such milk is sold in a container distinctly labelled “Kosher” or “Kedassia”, as the case may be; and
- (b) such milk has been prepared for consumption in accordance with the appropriate Jewish practice relating thereto.

SCHEDULE 2

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF MILK IN SCOTLAND

1. Subject to the provisions of this Schedule, the maximum price of milk on a sale by retail in Scotland, excluding the islands other than the islands of Islay, Coll and Gigha in the County of Argyll and those in the Counties of Bute and Orkney, shall be a price in accordance with the following table:—

Milk	Maximum Price (Rate per Pint)
Channel Islands milk	p 6½
South Devon milk	6½
Premium milk	6
Ultra Heat Treated milk	5½
Sterilised milk	5½
Homogenised milk	5½
Standard milk	5
Pasteurised milk	5
Milk, other than the above mentioned	5

2. A reasonable charge may be made by the seller in addition to the appropriate maximum price specified in the above table for milk sold by him as Kosher milk or Kedassia milk if—

- (a) such milk is sold in a container distinctly labelled “Kosher” or “Kedassia”, as the case may be; and
- (b) such milk has been prepared for consumption in accordance with the appropriate Jewish practice relating thereto.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This amending Order which comes into operation on 3rd November 1974, increases by $\frac{1}{4}$ p per pint the maximum retail prices of milk on sales in Great Britain.
