LOCAL GOVERNMENT, ENGLAND AND WALES

The Local Government (Allowances) (Amendment)

Regulations 1974

Made - - - - 31st October 1974

Laid before Parliament 12th November 1974

Coming into Operation 3rd December 1974

The Secretary of State for the Environment and the Secretary of State for Wales, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 173 and 178 of the Local Government Act 1972^(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations in relation, respectively, to England and to Wales:—

Title and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government (Allowances) (Amendment) Regulations 1974 and shall come into operation on 3rd December 1974.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889^(b) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Increase in the rates of financial loss allowances

3. In paragraph 3 of the Local Government (Allowances) Regulations 1974^(c) (which prescribes the rates of financial loss allowance) for sub-paragraph (2) there shall be substituted the following:—

“(2) The prescribed amount of financial loss allowance shall be—

(a) if the period of entitlement does not exceed 4 hours, £3.35;

- (b) if the period exceeds 4 hours but does not exceed 24 hours, £6.70;
(c) if the period exceeds 24 hours, £6.70 for each complete 24 hours plus the rate appropriate to the remainder of the period.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations increase the maximum rates of financial loss allowance payable for the performance of approved duties to any member of a body, to which sections 173 to 175 of the Local Government Act 1972 applies, who is not entitled to attendance allowance.
