**The Hill and Upland Sheep (Scotland) Amendment
Scheme 1974**

Made - - - - 7th November 1974

Laid before Parliament - 13th November 1974

Coming into Operation - 4th December 1974

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 13, 15(1) and 17 of the Hill Farming Act 1946(a), as applied by section 43 of the Agriculture Act 1967(b), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and with the approval of the Treasury, I hereby make the following scheme:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This scheme may be cited as the Hill and Upland Sheep (Scotland) Amendment Scheme 1974 and shall come into operation on 4th December 1974.

(2) This scheme shall be construed as one with the Hill and Upland Sheep (Scotland) Scheme 1972(c) (hereinafter referred to as “the principal scheme”).

Amendment of amount by which a subsidy payment is to be reduced in certain circumstances

2. In Column 3 of the Schedule to the principal scheme, for the amounts “80p”, “80p” and “55p”, being respectively the second, fourth and fifth entries in that column, there shall be substituted respectively the amounts “£1”, “£1” and “75p”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Scheme)

This Scheme alters the provisions of the Hill and Upland Sheep (Scotland) Scheme 1972 by amending the amount by which a subsidy payment under that scheme is to be reduced in respect of a flying flock or upland flock maintained (a) on hill land which comprises or forms part of such an agricultural unit as is described in the first entry in Column 2 of the Schedule to the scheme, (b) on hill land occupied by any person as a crofter or as an eligible occupier, and (c) on any other hill land.
