**HIGHWAYS, ENGLAND AND WALES****The New Street Byelaws (Extension of Operation) Order 1974***Made*       -       -       -       *29th March 1974*

The Secretary of State for the Environment and the Secretary of State for Wales, in exercise of their respective powers under the proviso to section 312(6) of the Highways Act 1959(a), as read with the Secretary of State for Wales and Minister of Land and Natural Resources Order 1965(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order as follows: —

**1.** This order may be cited as the New Street Byelaws (Extension of Operation) Order 1974.

**2.** Any byelaws in force on 31st March 1974, being byelaws remaining in force by virtue of the New Street Byelaws (Extension of Operation) Orders 1962(c), 1967(d) and 1972(e) shall remain in force until 31st March 1977 or until they are revoked, whichever date is the earlier.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

1. The Highways Act 1959 repealed certain enactments which had empowered local authorities to make new street byelaws, and provided that existing byelaws made under any of those enactments should cease to have effect on 30th April 1962, unless the Minister of Housing and Local Government extended their period of operation by Order under the Act of 1959.

2. That period was extended until 31st March 1974 by the New Street Byelaws (Extension of Operation) Order 1972, and this Order further extends it until 31st March 1977.
