**The Supplementary Benefit (Determination of Requirements)
Regulations 1974***Laid before Parliament in draft**Made - - - - 17th May 1974**Coming into Operation 22nd July 1974*

Whereas a draft of the following regulations was laid before Parliament and approved by resolution of each House of Parliament:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State for Social Services, with the consent of the Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Supplementary Benefit Act 1966(a) and now vested in her (b), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Supplementary Benefit (Determination of Requirements) Regulations 1974 and shall come into operation on 22nd July 1974.

(2) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, “the Act” means the Supplementary Benefit Act 1966(a) and other expressions have the same meaning as in the Act.

(3) The rules for the construction of Acts of Parliament contained in the Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations as they apply for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Amendment of provisions for calculating requirements

2.—(1) Part II (calculation of requirements) of Schedule 2 to the Act (provisions for determining the right to and amount of benefit) shall be varied in accordance with the following provisions of this regulation.

(2) For paragraph 9 (normal requirements) and paragraph 10 (blind persons' requirements) there shall be substituted the following paragraphs—

(3) In paragraph 12 (attendance requirements) and paragraph 13 (rent) there shall be substituted—

- (a) for each reference to £6·20 a reference to £8·00;
- (b) for each reference to £4·15 a reference to £5·35; and
- (c) for the reference to £0·80 a reference to £0·90.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations vary the provisions of Part II (calculation of requirements) of Schedule 2 (determination of right to and amount of benefit) to the Supplementary Benefit Act 1966 (the Ministry of Social Security Act 1966). Regulation 2 increases certain weekly amounts allowed for requirements; paragraph (2) relates to normal and blind persons' requirements and paragraph (3) to the attendance requirements of severely disabled persons and to the rent addition for non-householders. The Regulations come into operation on 22nd July 1974.
