

**1976 No. 112****CUSTOMS AND EXCISE****The Anti-Dumping Duty (Temporary Suspension) Order 1976**

*Made* - - - - 27th January 1976

*Laid before the  
House of Commons* - 28th January 1976

*Coming into Operation* 21st February 1976

The Secretary of State, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 1, 10(3) and 15(4) of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969(a) and now vested in him (b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping Duty (Temporary Suspension) Order 1976 and shall come into operation on 21st February 1976.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The anti-dumping duties imposed by the Anti-Dumping Duty (No. 2) Order 1972(d) on machinery for wrapping pre-formed individual pieces of confectionery originating in the German Democratic Republic and Berlin (East), which were temporarily suspended by the Anti-Dumping Duty (Temporary Suspension) Order 1975(e) for a period of twelve months beginning with 21st February 1975, shall not be chargeable on such machinery imported into the United Kingdom during a period beginning on 21st February 1976 and ending on 30th June 1977.
