1976 No. 1682**FOOD AND DRUGS****The Welfare Food (Amendment No. 2) Order 1976**

Made - - - 12th October 1976
Laid before Parliament 20th October 1976
Coming into Operation 15th November 1976

The Secretary of State for Social Services and the Secretary of State for Wales in exercise of powers conferred by sections 4 and 7 of the Emergency Laws (Re-enactment and Repeals) Act 1964^(a) and now vested in them^(b), acting with the Secretary of State for Scotland jointly in the exercise of those powers and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

Title, commencement and extent

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Welfare Food (Amendment No. 2) Order 1976 and shall come into operation on 15th November 1976.

(2) This order shall not extend to Northern Ireland.

Interpretation

2. In this order “the principal order” means the Welfare Food Order 1975^(c) as amended by the Welfare Food (Amendment) Order 1976^(d) and other words and expressions have the same meaning as in the principal order.

Amendment of the principal order

3.—(1) In article 6 (Milk for young children in day care) of the principal order the present paragraph shall be re-numbered “(1)” and after it shall be inserted—

“(2) The Secretary of State may make arrangements for a child who has not started school at the age of 5 years and 1 month to continue to receive milk under paragraph (1) of this article for such period as may elapse until he starts full-time education”.

(2) In Schedule 2 (Entitlement to welfare food other than liquid milk) to the principal order in column (3):—

- (a) for “20p” there shall be substituted “40p”,
- (b) for “5p” there shall be substituted “8p”, and
- (c) for “6p” in each place where it occurs there shall be substituted “10p”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order further amends the Welfare Food Order, 1975, as amended by the Welfare Food (Amendment) Order, 1976, by—

- (1) enabling children in day care to receive free milk until they start full-time education; (Article 3(1)), and
- (2) increasing the prices at which National Dried Milk, Children’s Vitamin Drops and Vitamin Tablets for expectant and nursing mothers may be bought as follows:—
 - (i) National Dried Milk: from 20p to 40p per pack.
 - (ii) Children’s Vitamin Drops: from 5p to 8p per bottle.
 - (iii) Mother’s Vitamin Tablets: from 6p to 10p per container. (Article 3(2)).
