**The Civil Aviation (Joint Financing) (Fourth Amendment)
Regulations 1976**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 4 and 7 of the Civil Aviation (Eurocontrol) Act 1962(a), as those sections are amended respectively by section 15 of the Civil Aviation Act 1968(b) and by paragraphs 6 and 7 of Schedule 10 to the Civil Aviation Act 1971(c), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and with the consent of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Civil Aviation (Joint Financing) (Fourth Amendment) Regulations 1976 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1977.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(d) shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. Regulation 3(1) of the Civil Aviation (Joint Financing) Regulations 1974(e), as amended(f), shall be further amended by substituting respectively for the sums £10.68, £6.71 and £3.97 the sums £13.52, £7.67 and £5.85.

We consent to the making of these Regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations further amend the Civil Aviation (Joint Financing) Regulations 1974, as amended, by increasing the charges payable by operators of aircraft to the Civil Aviation Authority in respect of crossings between Europe and North America. The charges are payable in pursuance of the Agreements of the Joint Financing of Certain Air Navigation Services respectively in Greenland and the Farøe Islands and in Iceland, opened for signature in Geneva on 25 September 1956 (Cmnd. Nos. 677 and 678).

The charges under the Geneva Agreements have been increased by a decision of the Council of the International Civil Aviation Organization.

The charges are required by the principal regulations to be remitted to the Governments of Denmark and Iceland, subject to deduction of a fee not exceeding 5 per cent for the Civil Aviation Authority's expenses in billing and collection.

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
