**Residential Establishments (Payments by Local Authorities)
(Scotland) Amendment Order 1976**

Made - - - - - 18th February 1976

Coming into Operation 1st April 1976

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 90(3) of and paragraph 2(2) of Schedule 7 to the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following order:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Residential Establishments (Payments by Local Authorities) (Scotland) Amendment Order 1976 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1976.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Increase in rate of payment

2. Article 3 of the Residential Establishments (Payments by Local Authorities) (Scotland) Order 1971(c) as amended (d) (which prescribes weekly payments to be made by local authorities in respect of the expenses of carrying on the establishments which were approved schools immediately before the commencement of Part III of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968) shall be further amended by the substitution of £51·31 for £36·75.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the Residential Establishments (Payments by Local Authorities) (Scotland) Order 1971 as amended by increasing from £36.75 to £51.31 the weekly payments to be made by local authorities in respect of the expenses of carrying on the establishments which were approved schools immediately before the commencement of Part III of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 and in relation to which functions were transferred to local authorities under section 1(5) of that Act.
